The word *'biodiversity'* is coined from biological diversity, which, put simply is another way of referring to the variety of life on the planet. Biodiversity is about the variety of plant and animal species and the interaction between them. It is this interaction that is essential for life, giving us all the things we need - clean air, water, agriculture, food and amenity.

Biodiversity is the foundation for life and for the essential services provided by ecosystems. It therefore underpins peoples' livelihoods and sustainable development in all areas of activity, including economic sectors such as agriculture, forestry, fisheries and tourism, among others. By halting biodiversity loss, we are investing in people, their lives and their well-being.



The Irish Peatland Conservation Council (IPCC)



The Irish Peatland Conservation Council (IPCC) is a national charity (CHY6829, RCN 20013547) based at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre. Established in 1982 the IPCC's mission is to conserve a representative sample of Irish peatlands for people to enjoy today and in the future. The IPCC give a voice to Irish peatland habitats and their associated ecosystem services through the Save the Bogs Campaign. This is the longest running campaign of the Council focusing on peatland research, species monitoring, policy and education. The IPCC owns two peatland reserves locally. Lodge Bog is an example of a raised bog habitat and Lullymore West is an abandoned cutaway that has regenerated as wet grassland known nationally for its diversity of butterflies.

Volunteers support the work of the IPCC and you are invited to get involved. You can also support the IPCC by joining as a Friend of the Bog. Discover the wet and wild peatlands of Ireland by visiting the IPCC or taking part in Féile and Dúlra, IPCC's free Festival of Nature. 

The site is notable for the presence of two rare species of Myxomycete fungus, namely Diderma chondrioderma and Licea testudinacea, the latter in one of only two known Irish sites.



Butterfly Conservation Ireland's reserve at Lullybeg has a wealth of nature to offer everyone. Blessed with an extraordinary range of habitats, the site boosts thriving populations of rare butterflies as well as the more frequent species, a high number of Ireland's dragonflies and some rare plants. This event will involve habitat creation for the Dingy Skipper, Dark Green Fritillary, Narrow-bordered Fivespot Burnet moth and other species. Bring work gloves, boots and loppers. Directions: This is reached from Allenwood by taking the R414 west and crossing Shee Bridge 1km from Allenwood on the left. Continue for 4 km and the Bog of Allen Nature Centre is on the right. Turn right here and continue for 100 metres to the T-junction. Turn left here along the track and continue. Pass through three gates. After the third gate, turn sharp left along the rough forest track for 500 metres. Supported by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage (NPWS) and the Local Biodiversity Action Fund 2023.


