- Applicants shall, not less than 4 working days before making an application for a Permit, give notice in writing to the Commissioner of the Garda Síochána of the proposed application enclosing a copy of the application.
- Applicants are required to pre-consult with the Bridge Management Section of Kildare National Roads Office and obtain approval in principle in relation to the movement of abnormal loads over/under structures on the National Road network. (Contact number 045 988900- E-mail kcc@kildarenrdo.com)
- Applicants are required to give 4 working days' notice to Kildare County Council before dates of travel to allow for processing of permit.
- The applicant must contact TII's Motorway Traffic Control Centre on email abnormalload@mtcc.ie a minimum of 72 hours in advance of the journey, where the load width is greater than 3m, to obtain clearance to travel on the Motorway/National Dual Carriageway Network. The Motorway Traffic Control Centre will confirm if any roadworks are planned along the route which will impact the abnormal load journey.
