APPLICATION FOR ABNORMAL LOAD PERMIT

An Abnormal load is one where the weight or any dimensions exceeds the maximum permissible for the vehicle as laid down in the Construction and Use of Vehicles Regulations

- Applicants shall, not less than 4 working days before making an application for a Permit, give notice in writing to the Commissioner of the Garda Síochána of the proposed application enclosing a copy of the application.
- Applicants are required to pre-consult with the Bridge Management Section of Kildare National Roads Office and obtain approval in principle in relation to the movement of abnormal loads over/under structures on the National Road network.

- Applicants are required to give 4 working days' notice to Kildare County Council before dates of travel to allow for processing of permit.
- The applicant must contact TII's Motorway Traffic Control Centre on email abnormalload@mtcc.ie a minimum of 72 hours in advance of the journey, where the load width is greater than 3m, to obtain clearance to travel on the Motorway/National Dual Carriageway Network.
The Motorway Traffic Control Centre will confirm if any roadworks are planned along the route that will impact the abnormal load journey.
