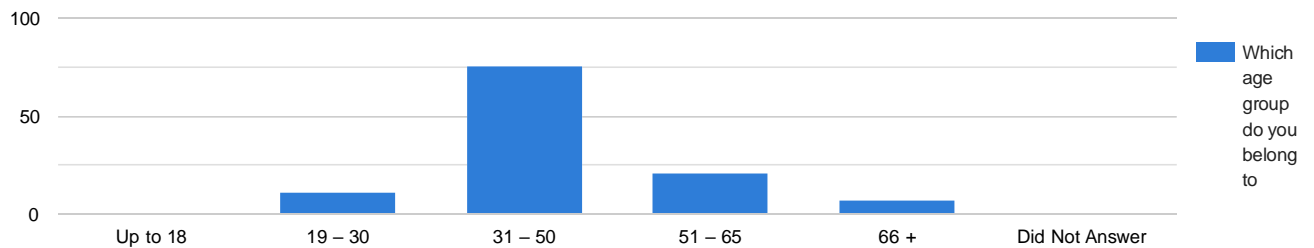

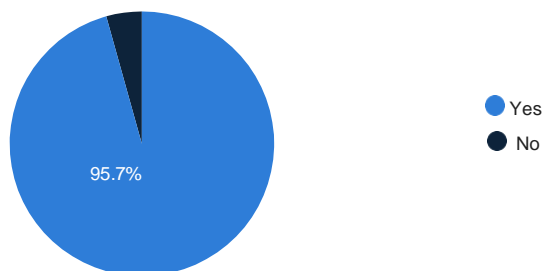

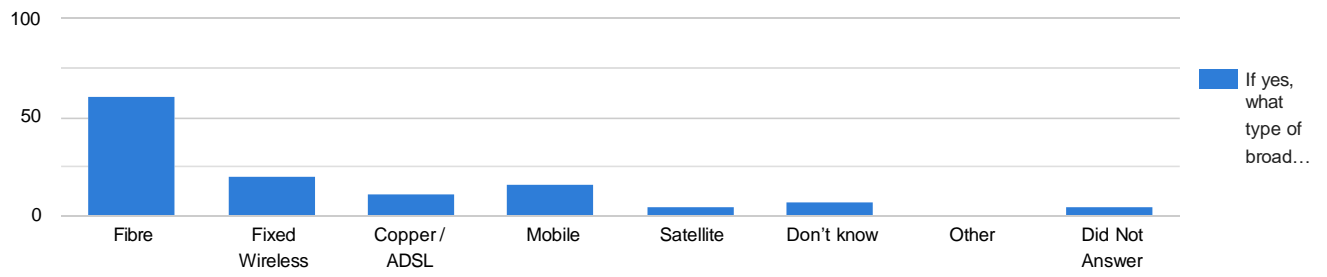

Do you have a broadband connection at home?



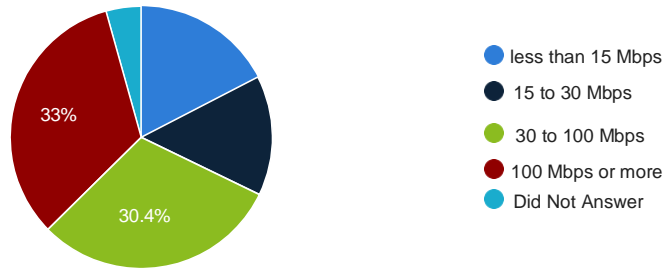

If yes, what type of broadband internet connection do you have?



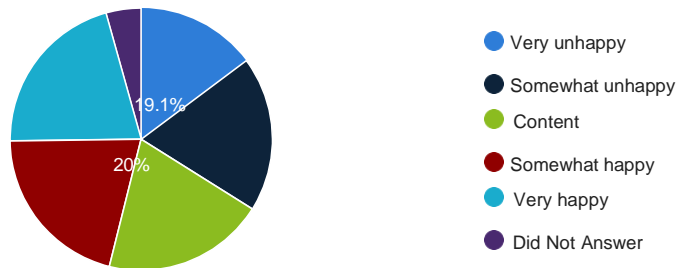

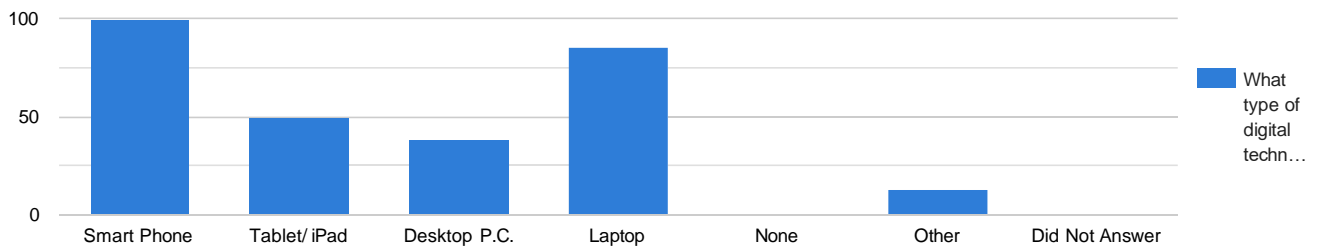

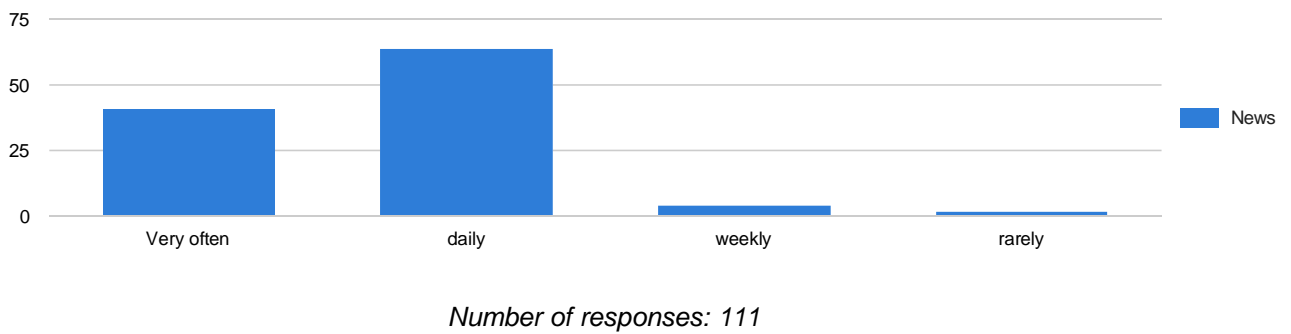

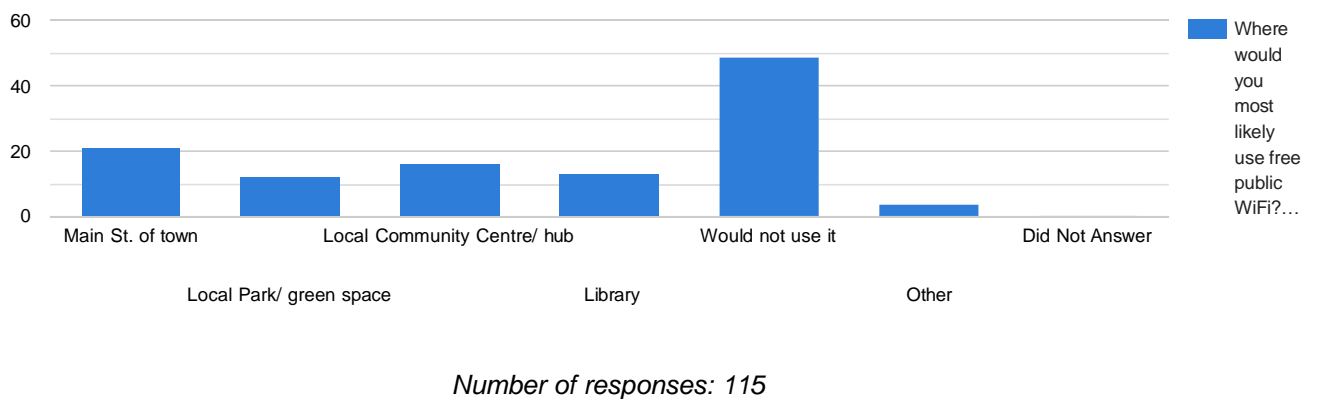

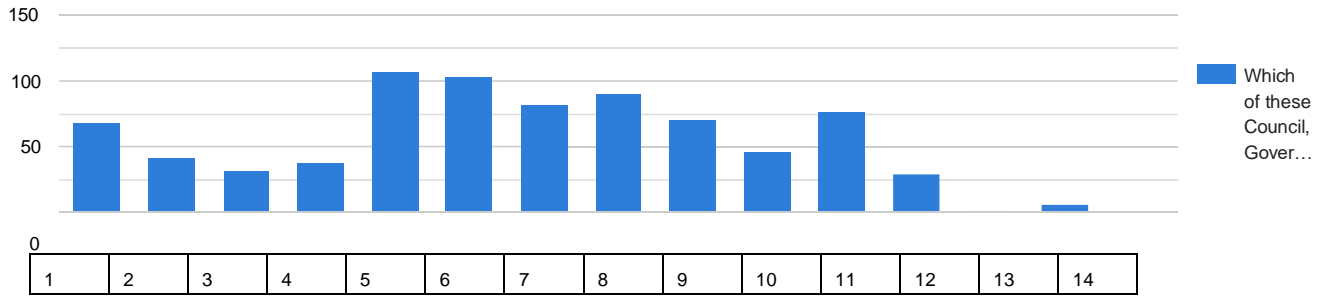

Where would you most likely use free public WiFi? (in a Public Space)



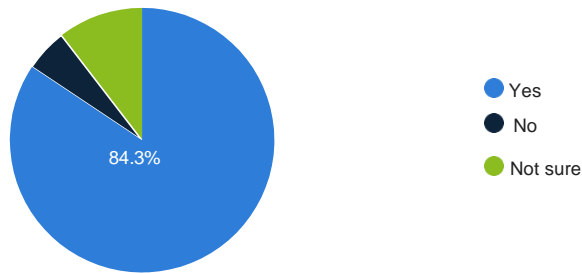

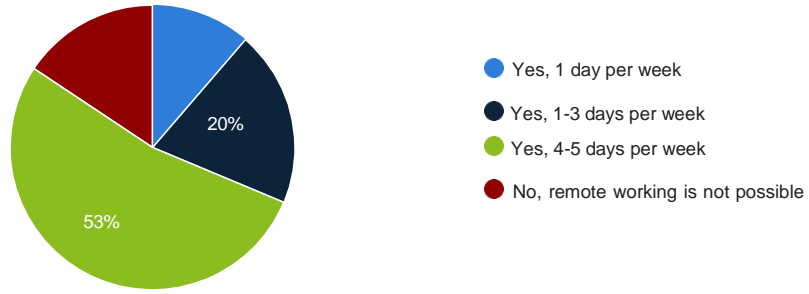

Synthesis of all commentary

- Ensure opportunities to install fiber is taken when infrastructural works are being done in both rural and urban areas – avoid the repetitive digging up of roads and footpaths.
- More transparency in Council business including webcasting / streaming of Council meetings.
- Improve web accessibility and user experience of Kildare.ie
- Multilingual information services for citizen information should be incorporated into future digital plans
- Use the remote working movement to reenergize towns and villages through the hubs as meeting and networking spaces as well as work spaces. Harness the community spirit and volunteerism that is in the community and make connections using digital.
- Use digital resources to enhance safety and accessibility of public spaces and ensure good data management policy
- Very poor internet in many parts of rural Kildare despite the overall county statistics of broadband and phone network coverage and speeds. This must be the main priority for the digital strategy. (Strongly recurring theme in open comments)
- Remote work will depend on good broadband – it is essential to ensure areas with poor broadband are prioritized for domestic, business and community needs.
- Ensure all citizens can participate in digital society by providing connectivity, skills and even devices to those at risk of exclusion.
- Addressing digital divide will mean there is an equitable approach to provision including digital devices for those who cant afford them as well as a skills for all programme.
