2. Confirmation of minutes / matters arising / conflict of interest

3. Twinning Policy & Guidelines – Denis McDermott

The Twinning Policy and Twinning Guidelines were circulated in advance of meeting. Discussion was held on the twinning budget and reporting mechanisms for the Twinning Liaison Committee. Both documents were approved for consideration by the Corporate Policy Group on the proposal of Cllr. Evie Sammon seconded by Cllr. Noel Heavey.

4. Youth Mental Health Provision – Susan Bookle / Emma Berney

The report 'Redressing the Balance: The business case for investment in integrated youth mental health service provision in Kildare West Wicklow' was circulated to the committee prior to the meeting. Both Emma Berney and Susan Bookle, via PowerPoint presentation, detailed the significant gaps in resources to deal with demand for services both in terms of staffing and funding arrangements generally regarding provision for mental health services for young people in County Kildare and West Wicklow. The committee was particularly concerned at the level of shortfall identified in County Kildare which has the highest proportion of under-25 years old persons in the country and it was agreed to send letters to the Minister for Health and the Health Service Executive to highlight these issues.

5. Right to Read programme – Marian Higgins / Amye Quigley

A report on the Right to Read programme circulated to all members in advance of the meeting. Amye Quigley further explained the programme to the committee via a PowerPoint presentation. The members expressed their support for this programme and acknowledged its importance for the community.
