Date for Local Election 2019

Confirmation has been received that Polling for the Local Elections 2019 and European will take place on Friday 24 May 2019.

Rural Regeneration and Development Fund

Minister Ring announced on 14 February that three applications submitted by Kildare County Council to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund have been successful in securing funding.

R411 Naas to Ballymore Road Realignment

From 11 February 2019 a full road closure is in place for up to eight weeks in order to allow for the realignment to tie into the existing R411 at each end. Diversions will be in place for the duration of the works.

Newbridge Southern Outer Orbital Route (NSOR)

Full traffic management has been implemented on the R445 Newbridge to Naas Road to allow the contractor to progress with realigning the R445 and to construct two new roundabouts.

Kildare Town Regeneration

A public consultation event took place on 01 February and over 450 submissions have been submitted to date.

Local Area Plans (LAP's) Leixlip LAP

Ministerial Direction issued in March 2018 confirming that the Leixlip LAP is not in compliance with the requirements of the Planning and Development Act. A new LAP is to be prepared for Quarter 1, 2019. In January, 2019 public consultation took place regarding existing social infrastructure and future requirements.

Naas LAP

It is anticipated that a Draft Naas LAP will be published and put on public display early in 2019.

Athy LAP

Work on the preparation of the Draft Athy LAP is ongoing.

Conservation

Built Heritage Investment Scheme 2019 (BHIS 2019)

This scheme will support small-scale, labour intensive conservation projects. The minimum level of funding awarded will be €2,500 up to a maximum of €15,000 per application.

Historic Structures Fund 2019 (HSF 2019)

This scheme replaces the Structures at Risk Scheme and offers funding in 2 streams:

Stream 1 offers grants from €15,000 -€50,000 aimed at essential repairs and smaller capital works for the refurbishment and conservation of heritage structures.

Stream 2 offers a smaller number of grants from €50,000 to €200,000 for larger enhancement, refurbishment or reuse projects involving heritage structures, where a clear community or public benefit is demonstrated. Both schemes operate on a match funding basis and details have been publicised on the council website. The closing date for submission of applications for both the BHIS 2019 and the HSF 2019 was 31 January 2019.

Library and Arts Service

Launch of THE "Ringing the Ogoni **Bells**" Exhibition in Athy Library Mayor of Kildare, Councillor Sean Power officially launched an exhibition in Athy Community Library on Tuesday 22 January. The exhibition is a result of collaboration between Maynooth University Library and Kildare County Council Library Services. Councillor Power welcomed the collaboration and thanked Sister Majella McCarron (OLA) for her involvement in the project and for making the journey to Athy. Maynooth University Library holds the death-row correspondence of Nigerian writer and activist Ken Saro-Wiwa to Sister Majella. The letters were smuggled out of military detention in breadbaskets. This exhibition features a number of letters and poems written by Ken Saro-Wiwa and photographs and panels telling the story of Ken Saro-Wiwa and the Ogoni issues. Helen Fallon, Deputy Librarian at Maynooth University spoke of the content of some of the letters and how the title "Ringing the Ogoni Bells" came about. She welcomed the

opportunity for Maynooth Unversity to collaborate with Kildare Library Services. Sister Majella was the final speaker on the evening and she recounted to the audience her involvement in telling the Ogoni story which dates back more than 20 years. Athy Community Library is the first Irish library to host the exhibition outside of Maynooth University. It has previously been exhibited at Quinnipiac University, in the United States as part of a Maynooth University international collaboration. The exhibition runs in Athy Community Library until 02 March and is free to access with no booking required.

Right to Read

Right to Read is a national programme literacy and reading development for people of all ages and backgrounds The recent "Family Time at Your Library" national programme, was attended by over 1,100 children and guardians in Kildare, in just over 50



storytelling and literacy support activities across our library network. A series of four talks under the title of "Reading for Pleasure" were hosted in the inclusive environments of Celbridge, Leixlip and Maynooth Community libraries in partnership with Froebel, Department of Primary and Early Childhood Education, Maynooth University and Children's Books Ireland in December 2018 and January 2019. The lectures were designed to assist parents and guardians in their support of children's reading for pleasure and education and included time for questions and participative discussion. It was a unique opportunity for parents to avail of the expertise of Maynooth University and Children's Books Ireland.

Work Matters at the Library 2019

The 2019 programme is taking shape and events will be taking place across the library network from April onwards. Events will cover topics such as digital branding and marketing, presentation skills and interview skills. This year the library service is partnering with the Local Enterprise Office and Citizen's Information Service in delivering this programme. Additional funding has been made available from the Department of Rural and Community Development to develop the nation online eBooks an eAudiobook service. As part of this, additional titles will be added to library online collections in support of the aims of the Work Matters at the Library programme.

Irish Language Events 2019

Plans are well underway for Seachtain na Gaeilge. Events will include writing workshops for schools with Richie Conroy, Raidió Rí which will give secondary school children the opportunity to learn and practice radio and television skills and bi-lingual workshops on Climate Change with Enda Reilly. Following on from the success of last year's programme, the plan is to incorporate the Four Celtic Festivals Imbolc, Bealtaine, Lúnasa and Samhain in this year's programme.



Parenting Programme

Kildare Library and Arts Service are officially launching our 'Lets talk about Parenting' Programme with a talk by Clinical Psychologist David Coleman in Athy Library on Tuesday 26 February at 7:00 p.m. The title of the talk is 'Scared Kids: Supporting children and teenagers growing up in an uncertain world'. The programme has been developed by Kildare Library and Arts Service with the support of the HSE, Tusla, www.parentingsupport.ie and the Kildare Childcare Committee. There will be 61 free talks taking place in Kildare Library over the course of the year covering topics such as healthy sleep habits, fostering childhood friendships, first aid, raising bilingual children in Ireland, childhood worries, keeping your kids safe online, and combating drugs and alcohol problems in teenagers. The programme is available on www.kildare.ie/library and printed copies of the brochures will be available in libraries soon.

Toys Technology and Training (TTT) The new series of talks/workshops for 2019 designed to offer support to children and adults with learning difficulties or disabilities was launched on 07 February in Leixlip Community Library with a screening of the documentary "This is Nicholas – Living with ASD". Attendance at this event was full capacity and the film-maker Nicholas Ryan Purcell attended and gave a moving speech following the film and answers audience questions. In all 75 events are planned in this year's programme including ASD friendly storytime, talks on ADHD, Behavioural Therapy, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia and Speech and Language. Science Technology Engineering Arts and Maths (STEAM) Programme

The STEAM Programme of events for primary schools in County Kildare has recently been finalised and circulated to schools in the county. The programme will again result in a large range of free workshops taking place in libraries in County Kildare throughout 2019. These workshops provide an opportunity to encourage and inspire Kildare students to take up STEAM subjects, along with providing them with an opportunity to test, explore and engage with topics relevant to science, maths and other related subjects through their local library. The 2019 STEAM Programme will start in early March with a large number of free workshops taking place in Kildare Libraries for Engineers Week 2019. Scribble-Bot workshops, K'NEX workshop and LEGO Further events under the STEAM Programme will take place throughout 2019 for Tech Week, Biodiversity Week, Space Week, Maths Week and Science Week. Engineering events are among the free events taking place. Engineers Week 2019 is taking place from 02 to 08 March 2019.

Healthy Ireland at Your Library Kildare Library Services have continued to participate in this national programme. The current series of events ended this month with plans in place for new events later in the year including a potential collaboration between Kildare Library Services and the HSE Oral Health Promotion Unit. Recent school events with boxer Eric Donovan proved very popular with schools around the county. There is an extensive range of resources available including books on topics of health and wellbeing and online resources such as eBooks, eAudiobooks and eMagazines. The top 5 non-fiction books borrowed nationwide in 2018 were from the Healthy Ireland at Your Library collection.



Decade of Commemorations

The 100th Anniversary of the First Dáil was commemorated on 23 January in the Osprey Hotel. The event was introduced by the Mayor of County Kildare, Councillor Seán Power and members of Lord Edward's Own Reenactment Group were on hand to add some period colour to the evening. The main event featured Ciara Plunkett, News Editor KFM, in conversation with the Ceann Comhairle, Seán Ó Feargháil and Coounty Kildare Members of the Oireachtas.

The book, "Witness! County Kildare and the 1916 Rising in the words of the participants", compiled and edited by Mario Corrigan Kildare Library Services was also launched.

Also in January, Mario Corrigan gave a presentation to the Association of Local Government on the work of the County Kildare Decade of Commemorations Committee and the upcoming 1500th anniversary of the death of Saint Brigid in 2023.

Water Services

Major Infrastructural Projects

Contract 2B (Network) Irish Water published confirmation of the CPO in January 2019. Irish Water has notified Coffey Construction that it is the preferred tenderer. It is anticipated that the works contract will be signed in Quarter 2, 2019.

Contract 2A (Newbridge Eastern Interceptor Sewer)

Murphy International Ltd., on behalf of Lidl, is laying part of the Eastern Interceptor Sewer along the route of the Newbridge Outer Orbital Relief Road between the dual carriageway and the Great Connell Road. These sewer works are well advanced. Irish Water has notified Roadbridge that it is the preferred tenderer for the scheme. It is expected that the main works contract will be signed in February 2019.

Minor Capital Projects Red Bog Watermain This project is now complete.

Allenwood to Kilmeague Watermain

The contract is now substantially complete and due to be snagged in February.



Suncroft to Brownstown Watermain Replacement

The contract is now substantially complete. Final road restoration works will be carried out at a later stage.

Newbridge Town Watermain Rehabilitation Works

The design for replacement of watermains in Piercetown, Highfield and Pairc Mhuire has commenced.

Kildare Town Watermain Rehabilitation Works

Watermains have been laid in Lourdesville, Claemore Terrace, Assumpta Villas and Campion Crescent. The transfer of services is ongoing.

Timolin Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) Upgrade

Part 8 approval was received in December 2017. The design can now be progressed further by Irish Water.

Calverstown WWTP Upgrade

Works are now substantially complete. The contractor is now process proving.

Taghadoe to Maynooth Watermain Replacment

The design for this scheme is almost complete. Installation works are due to commence in the coming weeks, once the road opening licence is granted.

Kilmeage WWTP Upgrade

The contractor is now on site and works are progressing well and due for completion in Quarter 2, 2019.

Newbridge Sewer Relining Contract Irish Water is appointing a contractor to do these works.

Rathangan Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) Upgrade

Irish Water has appointed a consultant to prepare the tender documents for this contract. The consultant is currently carrying out survey works and preparing the design.



Environment

Flooding

Catchment Flood Risk Assessment and Management Study (CFRAMS) Meetings have taken place with the Office of Public Works (OPW) regarding the prioritisation of works. A workshop with the OPW to progress the consultants brief for the Naas study has taken place. The municipal districts will be briefed on the emerging CFRAM Programme. Kildare County Council, as notice party cannot commence any works until the review is heard or withdrawn. Efforts are ongoing to resolve issues.

Athy Flood Modeling

Scenarios have been completed meaning that the proposed flood measure can be adopted into the Local Area Plan (LAP) as part of the Dominican Masterplan, subject to the approval of the elected members. A briefing will be given to March meeting of the Athy Municipal District.

Kerdiffstown

The proposed decision of the EPA was to award a Waste Licence which was issued on 06 February 2019. Taking possession of properties under the CPO has commenced. Two advanced

Public Realm Upgrade for Kildare Town

Consultants have been appointed and the consultation process is to commence in the coming weeks. A public consultation event took place on the 01 February and over 450 submissions were received to date.

Public Realm Upgrade for Newbridge

The consultants have been appointed and a presentation was given to public representatives on work to date and the application for Urban Regeneration Funding. It is proposed to host a public consultation event in conjunction with the National Transport Authority (NTA) on 27 February.





Economic Community and Cultural Development

Minister Ring announced on 14 February that three applications submitted by Kildare County Council to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund have been successful in securing funding €2.7 million has been awarded for the comprehensive upgrade of Emily Square in the centre of Athy, and the redevelopment of Athy Heritage Centre to become the Shackleton Museum. This key project will substantially increase the tourism potential of not only Athy, but the county as a whole and will also benefit the community both socially and economically. A further €80,000 in funding has been awarded for the advancement of a Masterplan for the former Dominican lands in Athy. This Masterplan will act as the catalyst for a significant urban regeneration of Athy town centre as follows:

> Flood defences to be designed in conjunction with the Office of

Public Works (OPW) to protect the lands.

- The creation of a New Dominican Square, urban renewal and regeneration by way of the creation of a new urban edge to the north of The Square.
- New eco-park on the lands at the confluence of the river Barrow and the Grand Canal.
- New Blueway visitor centre to the south of the site.

Funding of €78,000 has also been secured in respect of the development of a Public Realm Plan to shovel ready stage for Monasterevin. As with historic town centres across Ireland however, Monasterevin has faced challenges of sustaining social and economic activity. The result has been a gradual decline in the quality and character of the town centre, with prominent vacant buildings and a dominance of vehicles. This project



seeks to address these issues through a comprehensive programme of public realm enhancement.

Students of St. Brigid's Primary School travelled to Áras an Uachtaráin

Children from County Kildare travelled to Áras an Uachtaráin on Thursday 01 February as the county celebrated St. Brigid's Day. Sophie Hannon and Oisín Lee presented St. Brigid's Crosses to the President, Michael D Higgins, on St Brigid's Eve to mark the start of a week-long programme of activities commemorating the life of the Kildare native and Ireland's female patron saint.

It is expected that this process will be complete in the coming months. Children and Young Peoples Services Committee (CYPSC) A presentation was made by the CYPSC Co-ordinator on the themes emerging for the next strategic plan. Feedback was given by the LCDC for consideration in the finalisation of the plan. The need to continue close

collaboration to increase services and supports for children and young people in Kildare was agreed.

Heads-up (Mojo)

Funding is being secured for Heads-Up 2019. This continues to be a very successful programme with 172 men engaged in programmes across the county in 2018, with very high retention and progression rates. The next programme is being held in Athy

Age Friendly Programme

A presentation was made by the Age Friendly Co-ordinator on the themes emerging for the next strategic plan. The fridge magnets recently distributed to older people have been a major





success. The new plan is near completion.

Maynooth Eastern Ring Road LIHAF Project

The Roads, Transportation and Public Safety Department continues to work with Roughan & O'Donovan,

Consulting Engineers, in the design of a road scheme in Maynooth which links the R148 Leixlip Road and the R405 Celbridge Road. This scheme will include the construction of a bridge over the railway and Royal Canal. The ground investigation works have commenced and the Appropriate Assessment screening and Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) screening processes are ongoing. Once these works have been completed the council will be in a position to announce the preferred route option and are aiming to make this announcement in March/April.

Maynooth North - South Corridor, Phase 5 - Leinster Street to Kilcock Road

Final design revisions for Phase 5 of the North South Corridor are being undertaken by the consultant for this scheme. The council intend, that subject to funding approval being granted by the National Transport Authority (NTA), it will go to tender in April/May for a July August construction phase.



Maynooth North–South Corridor, Phase 6 - Moyglare Road Improvement Scheme The contract for the construction of Phase 6 – Moyglare Road Improvement Scheme has been awarded and construction will commence quite soon. A construction plan is currently being prepared.

Dublin - Galway Greenway This project is progressing satisfactorily and the council expect to complete the final design and tender documents by May for the Maynooth to Dublin boundary section.

Kilcock Park and Ride Facility This new pay by phone and pay and display car park is located in close proximity to the train station and facilitates commuters and long term parking in Kilcock. The signs contractor, under the supervision of the Roads, Transport and Public Safety Department has erected the new parking signs in Kilcock. The implementation of the regulation of parking in Kilcock has had a smooth transition and is now operational with full enforcement of two hour maximum stay in the town centre.

R411 Naas to Ballymore Road Realignment

Realignment of the R411, Naas to Ballymore Road has been in progress for the past two months. From 11 February 2019, a full road closure is in place for up to eight weeks in order to allow for the realignment to tie into the existing R411 at each end. Diversions will be in place for the duration of the works. The works are being carried out by Cairn Homes as part of the construction of Oak Park Residential Development.

Coghlanstown, Ballymore Eustace -Slope Remediation Project The statutory Part 8 for the Slope Remediation Project at Coghlanstown, Ballymore Eustace public consultation process commenced on 05 February, 2019. 

The plan is one of eight regional jobs plans to be published over the coming months, as part of a new regional jobs strategy led by the Minister for Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation, Minister Heather Humphreys.
