That planning applications in Kildare for in excess of 50 houses be conditioned to include an all-weather play area and a biodiversity garden, suitable for a variety of uses.

That the council give an update as to when the report on the dumping at Donnolly's Hollow can be shown to the elected members and to the public.



24. Councillor Bill Clear

That the council confirm that they have applied for funding available from Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport to carry out placement of warning signs on safe passing distance for cyclists and inform/liaise with the members on the proposed locations.

25. Councillor Kevin Duffy

That the council undertake a countywide consultative review of School Warden services, including Junior Warden services, incorporating all serviced and non-serviced primary schools; documenting the current provision of services, their location, effectiveness and opportunities or risks to these services, as well as a prioritised list for future school warden locations to inform any future decision making to amend or extend the school warden services within the county in 2021.

That the council join with the four local authorities in Dublin who have identified the need for an electric vehicle charging network, to support EV uptake. In order to inform the four authorities in Dublin of the requirements and the number, types and optimal location of chargers required, a strategic overview of the Dublin region is sought from suitable service providers and therefore, I ask Kildare County Council to join in that process to save costs rather than running our own review later.
