Planning, Strategic Development and Public Realm

County Development Plan Variation No 1 was made on 9 June 2020 and, in line with legislation, came into immediate effect. This incorporated the population allocation projected for the region (Eastern Midlands Regional Assembly's (EMRA'S) Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy (RSES) to Kildare County Council. Background work on research papers are underway in advance of the County Development Plan (CDP) review which is due to be initiated in early 2021. Local Area Plans (LAP's)

Work is ongoing in the preparation and formulation of a number of Local Area Plans (LAP's). The LAP's are supported by various assessments such as Social and Physical Infrastructure Assessments, Urban Regeneration Strategies and Flood Risk and Environmental Assessments. It is anticipated that the LAP's will begin to be published in Quarter 4, 2020. Revised public consultation arrangements will be required to adhere to public health guidance around gatherings/meetings.

Housing

Summary of Social Housing Assessments 2020

The council has been directed by the Minister for Housing, Planning and Local Government, under Section 21 of the Housing (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2009, that each housing authority is required to prepare a summary of housing needs of the social housing assessments carried out in its administrative area. The Minister has directed that the summary be prepared on 02 November 2020. The 2020 summary is the continuation of the process of annual assessments of national housing needs which commenced with the 2016 summary. The applications which require review are those that were approved prior to 31 December, 2010.

The key output of the summary remains the net need figure i.e. the number of qualified households on the council's housing list whose housing need has not been met. It is, therefore, essential that all households included on the list of qualified households meet the criteria of eligibility and need set out in the Social Housing Assessment Regulations, and also that the council's total figure does not include certain households, such as those on transfer lists or in accommodation provided under the Rental Accomodation Scheme (RAS) or the Housing Assistance Payment (HAP).

Over the coming weeks the Housing Department will be making contact with the relevant applicants on their housing list to ensure that all applicants are compliant with the social housing assessment regulations and are still in need of housing. In the meantime the council will encourage housing applicants to ensure that their housing applications are up to date.





Housing Assistance Payment (HAP) A total of 476 Housing Assistance Payment (HAP) applications have been processed year to date. The emergency measures in the Public Interest Act 2020 expired on the 01 August, this Act prohibited the termination of tenancies and rent increases.

From 02 August the Residential Tenancies and Valuation Act 2020 sets out new protections for tenants who are in rent arrears; tenants who contracted COVID-19 and were not paid by their employer or are in receipt of the temporary wage subsidy or any other social welfare payment due to loss of earnings. Due to Covid-19 inviduals can receive additional protections to remain in their tenancy without any increase in rent until January 2021. Money Advice and Budgeting Services (MABS) has a role in advising tenants on this matter. Private Rented Inspections Inspections of private rented properties to ensure compliance with minimum rental standards resumed in July. Additional health and safety procedures have been put in place to protect staff and tenants, as a result of these precautions the number of daily inspections has reduced.

Mortgage to Rent Scheme

In 2019 Home for Life were appointed as a national Mortgage to Rent (MTR) provider, prior to this all MTR properties were purchased by Approved Housing Bodies (ABH's). The occupants of Home for Life properties are tenants of Kildare County Council, however Home for Life are responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the properties. In August the first of these tenancies commenced, with three households signing tenancy agreements.

Homeless Services

Engagement with the Mid East Regional Homeless Local Authorities (Meath and Wicklow) and the HSE is continuing, in addition to fortnightly engagement with the national leads for homelessness through the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage. Increasing presentations of single people continues to challenge Homeless Services, however, progress is being made in moving individuals and families on from private emergency accommodation through allocations and the work of the Homeless HAP service. The Homeless HAP Officer continues to work with families in emergency accommodation, however the rate of refusals of accommodation and failure to attend appointments for viewings was 19% in the past months.

A further issue arising nationally is a significant increase in HAP arrears with over 6,000 now in arrears, which represents a 50% increase since COVID-19 commenced. Housing Agency will shortly update LAs on revised procedures/timelines for dealing with HAP arrears.



Number of Allocations

498 allocations were made up to 31 August 2020, which represents 1,585 individuals and dependents.

Midland Energy Efficiency Retrofitting Programme

Kildare County Council is one of 8 counties eligible for funding under this scheme. The budget set aside for Kildare County Counsil is €3.2 million over 2020/2021.

Kildare County Council has tendered 3 sample units for energy upgrade works as permitted under the scheme. The purpose of these three units is to showcase to tenants interested in the scheme the benefits of energy renovations to households. The tender for these 3 units is presently with the DHPLG for review.

The initial funding allocation will fund the retrofitting of approximately 70 units. Kildare County Council will **Water Services** prepare a list of suitable units for inclusion in the programme and will engage with tenants interested in the scheme. Units will be surveyed in the coming months for the preparation and issue of tender documentation for the initial phase.

The council expect the programme to run over 4 phases. The National University of Ireland (NUI) Galway are undertaking a research project called HAVEN. The aim of the project is to investigate the health impacts and related benefits of energy retrofitting. The council will be actively participating with the NUI on this project, to recruit home occupants who are partaking in the Midlands Energy Retrofitting Programme onto the HAVEN research project.

Infrastructural Projects



Contract 2A (Newbridge Eastern Interceptor Sewer)

This contract was signed by Irish Water and Roadbridge on 20 February 2019 and it had a 24-month construction programme. The works are currently being commissioned. The sewerage network is due to be handed over to operations by the end of 2020 while the pumping stations will be operated by the contractor for a 12month proving period before being handed over to operations. Murphy International Ltd., on behalf of Lidl (subject to an Irish Water agreement), has laid part of the Newbridge Eastern Interceptor Sewer along the route of the Newbridge Outer Orbital Relief Road between the dual carriageway and the Great Connell Road. These works are now being commissioned before being handed over to operations.

Contract 2B (Network)

This contract was signed by Irish Water and Coffey Construction Ltd on 08 August 2019 and it has a 30-month construction programme. Works commenced on site in September 2019 and are advancing well. New work fronts have been opened on the R407 Clane to Sallins Road, in Naas outside the Áras Chill Dara on the Newbridge and John Devoy Roads and in Newbridge Town.

Osberstown Sludge Treatment Facility DBO Contract Variation Veolia Water Ireland is advancing works on this variation to the Design Build Contract (DBO) contract, with an expected completion date in Quarter 3-4, 2020. Operational commissioning is continuing the Thermal Hydrolysis Process Plant.

Osberstown Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) The upgraded Osberstown WWTP

was handed back to Irish

Water/Kildare County Council operations in January 2020.

Maynooth Transfer Pipeline



This project involves the upgrading of the existing Maynooth Sewerage Pumping Station and the construction of a new sewerage pipeline along a new route from the pumping station to the Leixlip Wastewater Treatment Plant. This project is at planning and design stage. Site investigation works have recently commenced.

Irish Water has commenced engagement with landowners as part of the land and wayleave process.

Allenwood Sewerage Network (Vacuum System) Modification While funding constraints have emerged on the part of Irish Water in light of the current COVID-19 Pandemic, the council continues to work with the utility to progress a temporary solution which involves: The benefits of the above would be elimination of the need for tankering. Accordingly, as there are expected to be cost savings, it is still anticipated

Water Networks Management Projects

Newbridge Town Watermain Rehabilitation Works – Pairc Mhuire, Newbridge Back Yard Services Scheme (BYSS) Works resumed on 07 July 2020. To date, all public side works have been completed where customer consent has been provided. There are 20 premises remaining within this scheme, whereby, private side service connection works have still to be completed. Permanent road reinstatement works are currently ongoing as part of this scheme. fully complete. Additional works during July 2020 were also carried out in this area, in conjunction with the Cleamore Road/Academy Street Road Improvement Scheme. This involved the transferring of all water service connections from an existing cast iron watermain to an existing uPVC watermain. This will allow for the decommissioning of all cast iron watermains along Cleamore Road.

Taghadoe to Maynooth Watermain Replacement

The new section of watermain has now been in operation for one year and all reinstatement works have now been finalised. This scheme is now fully complete.

Maynooth Bottleneck Mains Scheme Testing and commissioning works were carried out during July on the new sections of watermain. This new section of watermain is now in operation. Permanent road reinstatement works were completed on 20 August 2020 as part of this scheme.

St Patrick's Terrace, Naas Back Yard Service Scheme

This scheme involves the installation of 115 metres of new watermain together with associated assets on St Patrick's Terrace, Naas. The works also include the transferring of all existing service connections from the existing cast iron watermain to a new HDPE watermain within the public road. This scheme is currently at Detailed Design Stage and it is expected that construction works will commence in Quarter 4, 2020.

Irish Water Updates

The Minister for Housing, Planning and Local Government recently launched a





stimulus package which includes a €30m fund allocated to the Water Conservation programme and €13m for Capital maintenance. Minister O'Brien states that "It will lead to activit across all 26 counties addressing leakage, water scarcity and drought."

Return of Councillor Clinics

Irish Water has advised that they will recommence Councillor Clinics from next month. They will be held online for approximately one hour and the target is to have held one for each LA by end of 2020.

Environment Services COVID-19

Recycling Banks

Burial Grounds

All the council's cemeteries remain open to the public. The HSE's social distancing guidelines should be observed when visiting cemeteries. Please note that vehicular access may at times be restricted. The increase in glass tonnage at recycling banks has continued through to July. In 2019, 338 and 367 tonnes of glass were recovered from the recycling banks in June and July, respectively. This year, the figure is 563 and 496 - an increase of nearly 40%. Staff and contractors continue to maintain existing sites to an acceptable standard, but the cooperation of the public is vital in this regard. As the community-based sports facilities have partially reopened for the public, this is beginning to reduce pressure on the recycling infrastructure.

All construction schemes have been suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions until further notice Catchment Flooding

Catchment Flood Risk Assessment and Management Study (CFRAMS) Meetings have taken place with the Office of Public Works (OPW) regarding the prioritisation of works. A Steering Group with the OPW has been established to progress the consultant's brief for schemes within Kildare. The municipal districts will be briefed as schemes from the CFRAMs programme are commenced.

Morell Flood Management Scheme Construction of the scheme is now underway, beginning with Phase 1 embankments and walls.



Athy Flood Relief Scheme

The Kildare County Council/OPW Steering Group has commenced developing the scope of the Athy Flood Relief Scheme. The first stage will be the procurement of consultants to carry out the design of the scheme.

Hazelhatch

The contract for a further hydrological study into flooding at Hazelhatch has been awarded to RPS Ireland. The scope of the study has been extended to allow for a blockage scenario in the catchment, as this has been an issue in previous flood events. The study is completed, with final reports due in September. The revised mapping will be used by the OPW to update flood

A presentation of the findings will be made to the September meeting of the Leixlip-Celbridge Municipal District.

Naas Flood Relief Scheme

Tenders have been received for consultancy services for the Naas Flood Relief Scheme. Assessment of these tenders is complete, and the contract is scheduled to be awarded in September. The first stage of the scheme will be a review of the existing hydrology and mapping.

Kerdiffstown

Construction works on the L2005 realignment is continuing with traffic management in place. New stone boundary walls have been constructed as part of the accommodation works with the existing houses. Drainage and utilities are been laid, including a section of new riser main on behalf of Irish Water. Kerbing has been installed and the laying of blacktop has commenced. It is anticipated that realignment of the L2005 will be completed at the end of September this year.

The tenders for the main works have been assessed and a preferred bidder has been identified. It is anticipated that the Contract Award will be in late October subject to procurement processes and paperwork being finalised.

Monitoring of the gas and groundwater boreholes as well as the management of the leachate and gas is ongoing, in accordance with the EPA Licence. The 3D visualization Model of the Proposed Park can be viewed at home on Kildare County Council's website at:

Eastern and Midlands Climate Action Regional Office (CARO)

The CARO is currently working on a number of fronts to support its constituent local authorities to drive climate action projects in their counties with a particular focus on implementing the actions contained within their climate adaptation strategies. A number of projects are ongoing across the Eastern and Midlands region, including:

Sustainable Energy Communities (SEC's)

The CARO continues to work with Kildare, Meath and Wicklow County Councils to pilot SEC's in partnership with the local authority. A Sustainable Energy Community webinar will be hosted by CARO on the 08 September to inform all constituent local authorities about this initiative with speakers from Kildare County Council, Meath County Council, community groups and the SEAI. It is intended that this event will catalyse action in this area across the other counties in the region.

Forestry

The CARO's initial involvement in this area was to work in collaboration with Coillte and the Department of Agriculture to identify a number of pilot counties and appropriate landholdings, for afforestation, in the region. All constituent local authorities were since represented at a recent webinar and received presentations from CARO and the Department of Agriculture Food and Marine (DAFM). This scheme was published by the DAFM on 12 August and the CARO is working to support a number of counties as they begin the process of identifying suitable lands.

Just Transition

The CARO is engaging with the Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) on the Just Transition Fund for the midlands region. Following on from the initial application to the SMART process, a more detailed application for funding is now being prepared for community training and capacity building across the 21 identified communities in the greater



just transition area. If this application is successful, this project will develop in collaboration with Westmeath, Longford, Laois, Kildare, Roscommon, Galway, Longford and Offaly County Councils and will leverage existing structures (such as the PPN, Cohmairle na nÓg, Local Community Development Committees (LCDC's) and municipal districts, to engage with the relevant communities.

Capacity Building

The CARO continues to work with its strategic training partners (such as Climate Ireland, Met Eireann, The Environment Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Public Works (OPW), The Department of Communications, Action and Environment (DCCAE), The Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) etc.) to develop a suite of training for all elected members and local authority staff. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, it has been decided to prioritise the development and delivery of online training in 2020 and this will be available for roll out in Quarter 4 of this year. It is now expected that the online training and 3-day Climate Action Team training programmes will

be piloted in early October (it has been decided to pilot the 3 day programme across six ½ days, online, due to the current restrictions) and rolled out thereafter pending further refinement if so required. The CARO is also working closely with the Association of Irish Local Government (AILG) and the County and City Management Association (CCMA) to arrange a joint launch of this ambitious training programme and this is expected to take place in early October.

Spatial Planning

The CARO continues to work closely with the three regional assemblies to assist local authority planners to translate regional climate objectives into local policies for inclusion in county development plan reviews. A workshop has been held for the Eastern and Midlands Regional Assembly (EMRA) area. Further events will be held for the southern and western regions as soon as Covid-19 restrictions allow. Furthermore, the CARO is also working closely with the Office of the Planning Regulator (OPR) to ensure that the content of proposed training for elected members aligns



with the requirements of current spatial planning policy.

Key Performance Indicators:

The CARO is currently working on a draft set of indicators to measure local authority performance against the requirements of the All of Government Climate Action Plan 2019 and subsequent Climate Action Charter, as signed by all county councils. The draft set of indicators will be presented to the CCMA for review and discussion in the coming weeks.

Adaptation Planning Progress Reporting

The CARO is currently drafting a national reporting template for use by all 31 local authorities to report on progress in implementing their climate change adaptation strategies. This template will also be used to collate the information required for the sector to report on its climate action charter commitments in relation to adaptation planning. Kildare Climate Action Team Kildare County Council's arrangements to recruit a Climate Action Officer and Energy Efficiency Officer have been put in place with the Climate Action Officer interviews completed and the Energy Efficiency Officer interviews will he held week commencing 07 September. It is expected that both positions will be filled in the coming weeks.

The Kildare County Council Climate Action Team has resumed meetings and is now working to compile a progress report on the implementation of its Climate Change Adaptation Strategy over the past 12 months.

New Initiatives

Green Kilometre Scheme 2020 Fifteen groups have signed up to this scheme so far in 2020 and a total of 800 saplings have been planted by the groups this year. A community-based litter removal scheme for rural areas has also become a good biodiversity project with native species such as holly, hazel, spindle and alder buckthorn being planted into Kildare



hedgerows. It is hoped the scheme will gain momentum over the course of the year.

Civic Amenity Site North

The Part 8 has been approved by the Celbridge-Leixlip Municipal District Committee. The council is in the course of putting together an expression of interest invitation for a Concession/Public Private Partnership (PPP) type contract. **Dog Pound**

The dog pound extension and upgrade works are now complete. The facility is now fully reopened. Public access is by appointment.

The Part 8 in respect of The Square (first phase) has now been prioritised (a traffic plan needs to be progressed to facilitate phase 2). Carparking has been removed from Market Square as a temporary pilot to encourage social distancing.

Public Realm Upgrade for Newbridge

It is proposed to progress to a further round of public consultation before progressing to the next stage of design.

The Barrow Blueway

Works have commenced on the Barrow Blueway at Milltown Bridge (3km north of Athy).

Management of The Curragh Plains Research is ongoing with public consultation to commence in Quarter 4, 2020.



Roads, Transportation and Public Safety

Twelve Cycle Café Schemes Approved

Kildare County Council has approved applications from 12 local businesses as a host for a 'Designated Cycle Café' in the county. Six other applications are pending approval while three more are awaiting inspection visits.

The Barrow Blueway and the Naas to Sallins Greenway proved to be attractive amenities in each application received from businesses in Athy and Sallins respectively, while other amenities around the county have also been key to applications received.

The purpose of a '*Cycle Café*' is to promote cycling and provide cyclists and cycling groups with a '*pit stop*' to allow them a refreshment or toilet break along their route, the use of a bicycle repair unit if required and to take advantage of local attractions, amenities and tourism. The Cycle Café Scheme in Kildare was first introduced at 'Fogarty's Pavilion' shop in Ballymore Eustace and its proprietor, Mr Sean Fogarty was happy to allow the council to develop the idea further around the county. The new Cycle Café schemes will be officially launched during Bike Week and European Mobility Week in September. Kildare County Council has secured funding of €8,500 from the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport (DTTAS) to help support Bike Week initiatives this year, in addition to further funding of €50,000 from the Department of Rural and Community Development for Cycle Café schemes.

Mr Keogh, Kildare County Council's Road Safety, Cycling and Sustainable Transport Officer welcomed the funding and said it will boost the profile of cycling and tourism in Kildare. "We are delighted our funding application was approved. Cycle Cafés will bring additional business and tourism to the county, and in addition to that, it will add to the attractions which local amenities



offer. The approved designated Cycle Café's will help boost the profile and benefits of cycling in Kildare and also ensure that cyclists are provided with much needed 'pit stops' along their routes, while also taking in the lovely attractions and amenities the county has to offer."

M7 Widening, Osberstown Interchange and Sallins Bypass Project

SIAC Construction Ltd/Colas Ltd. is the contractor. The contractor has opened 3 lanes both eastbound and westbound from Junction 8 Johnstown to Junction11 (M7/M9 merge). Works continued on the Osberstown Interchange and the R407 Sallins Bypass since the lifting of the lockdown in May. Kildare County Council is liaising with the contractor with regard to a revised completion date.

M4 Maynooth to Leixlip

The 'M4 Maynooth to Leixlip' is listed as a section of the transport network to be progressed through pre-appraisal and early planning and prioritised for delivery under the National Development Plan 2018–2027. The aim of the project is to assess the needs of the M4/N4 mainline corridor and junctions from Maynooth to Junction 5 Leixlip in terms of catering for future demand from a capacity, safety and operational perspective.

Arup have been appointed as technical advisors to support the delivery of the project through Phases 1 to 4. These phases include:

- Phase 1 (Concept and Feasibility) which would determine if an intervention (project) is required and if an intervention is feasible.
- Phase 2 (Option Selection) would examine feasible options for intervention that could address the aim of the project.



 Phase 3 (Design and Environmental Evaluation) would develop the design of the preferred option from Phase 2 for further assessment including evaluation of environmental impacts; and Phase 4 (Statutory Processes) would include undertaking the Statutory Processes.

The project is currently in the final stages of Phase 1 (Concept and Feasibility) and Kildare National Roads Offfice are completing the deliverables for submission to Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) to sign off Phase 1. The scheme will take a number of years to pass through the various steps required for Phase 1 (Concept and Feasibility), Phase 2 (Option Selection), Phase 3 (Design and Environmental Evaluation) and Phase 4 (Statutory Processes), provided it successfully progresses through each phase.

Maynooth Eastern Relief Road and Bridge

The preferred route option, (C), was presented in committee to the Maynooth Municipal District Committee on 05 April 2019. The Clane-Maynooth Municipal District Committee confirmed approval of the Part 8 in respect of Option C on 29 July. Detailed design and CPO preparation stages are now underway.

The next phase of the project will be the completion of design and procurement of the main contract. However, Kildare County Council is currently endeavoring to gain control of the lands (identified under the Local Infrastructure Housing Activation Fund (LIHAF) Scheme as a prerequisite to the contract going ahead. The preparation of CPO documentation is near completion and the documentation for the procurement of valuers is under way. Discussions are ongoing with landowners, the LIHAF, Irish Water, Waterways Ireland and larnród Éireann. The procurement of a NOBO consultant (an independent consultant to assess adequacy of the



proposed design in relation to the EU Interoperability Directive) is currently under way.

Athy Distributor Route

An Bord Pleanála's approval issued on 11 October, 2017. A Notice of Confirmation for the Athy Distributor Road was published in the Nationalist and Leinster Leader 28 November 2017. No objections/Judicial Reviews were received by the deadline on 23 January 2018. €3 million was included in the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport (DTTAS) road grants 2019 for this project. Notices to treat have been issued. Notice of entry on lands has been issued. Advance works between Corran Ard and Fortbarrington Road have been completed. The railway abandonment is complete. The removal of the rails and sleepers is complete. The Córas Iompair Éireann (CIE) lands have been secured from trespassers and the main contract commenced tender on 25 March. The procurement is under the restricted procedure and involves a two-stage process. The first

stage return will be due at the end of May 2021. The consultants are currently focused on document preparation for Stage 2 and dealing with queries for stage 1. The agreements with CIE and Waterways Ireland are a necessary prerequisite to commencement of construction and are being progressed. Land acquisition is also progressing. The team are currently closing out archaeology before the main contract is awarded. Work to achieve a Bridge Agreement with larnród Éireann continues with the submission of various technical reports. The following procurements are currently under way:

- Category 3 check by independent consultant



Maynooth Inner Relief Street Moyglare Road to Dunboyne Road: Planning approval was issued by An Bord Pleanála to Cairn Developments Plc. Works are progressing well.

Newbridge Outer Orbital Route Naas Road to Great Connell Road Newbridge: Construction has progressed well to date.

Northern Link Street and South Green Area Access Improvement Scheme (Kildare Town)

The route selection process is ongoing and consultation with larnród Éireann has commenced regarding the design of an upgrade/replacement bridge over the railway. A briefing was delivered to the Kildare Newbridge Municipal District Committee on 12 June.

A non- statutory Public Consultation was held on 18 June at the Kildare Education Centre. All submissions received have been considered. The project is unlikely to proceed to statutory procedures until the Kildare Town Transport Strategy has been completed due to the reservations of Kildare-Newbridge Municipal District Committee.

Local Community Development Committee September 2020

The last Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) meeting was held via teleconference on Wednesday 01 July 2020.

COVID-19 Community Response Forum

The Kildare COVID-19 Community Response Forum have had thirteen meetings to date via teleconference. The purpose of the Forum is to lead the co-ordination of COVID-19 community supports and resilience. A dedicated COVID-19 support helpline was established on 30 March by Kildare County Council. While the lockdown was in place, the helpline was constantly monitored to assess call levels, requests made and staffing requirements. However, the demand did not increase. This structure continues to be in place and the forum will continue to meet.

Healthy Ireland

The Healthy Ireland project partners continue to make progress. Given the COVID-19 restrictions they are working under, they continue to run a wide range of online activities from work out classes from home to movement programmes for older people and those with limited mobility. The first financial and non-financial reports were submitted as required to Pobal on 03 of September. There is flexibility to carryover budgets from Year 1 (end 30 June 2020) to Year 2 (end 30 June 2021).

Community Enhancement Programme (CEP)

Applications are now being sought under the Community Enhancement Programme 2020 (CEP). This funding is available for community and voluntary groups and small scale capital works. Priority is given to projects in disadvantaged communities or working with disadvantaged



individuals. The closing date is **3:00** p.m. on Friday 25 September.

Work continues to promote and support applications to the LEADER Programme. Work is concluding to present a range of projects to the next LCDC/Local Action Group (LAG) meeting. Kildare Fáilte

Key Activities

A Zoom meeting was held for the Kildare Fáilte Tourism and Hospitality Sector members and invited guests, with Mr David McWilliams as a headlining guest speaker. The event was a great success with over 60 people registering. Kildare Fáilte received positive comments and feedback from attendees. The event was published on online and offline media.

The Taste of Kildare committee met through Zoom to discuss alternative festival ideas and the practicality of the festival going forward. It was decided that, if possible, the festival will go ahead but with reduced capacity. The possibility and viability of organising a pre-Christmas food trail, Taste of Kildare, was discussed. Potential locations, such as Kildare Town, Market Square, will be investigated. Kildare Fáilte organised for the Irish Times journalist, Ms Arlene Harris to visit Kildare on a press trip in July. She visited various locations in Kildare over two days for a lifestyle article about Kildare which will be published in September.

LEADER funding was confirmed for developing the Strategic Plan 2021-2025, and for a marketing initiative, which includes the redevelopment of <u>www.intokildare.ie</u>, publishing a tourism brochure for County Kildare, and a large digital campaign advertising Kildare. The work for these projects will commence in September depending on budget.

Ms Mangan attended a number of seminars and online workshops including Tourism Ireland's Virtual Industry Event, and Sustainability in a Post-Covid19 World: Building the Business Case for the Tourism Industry.



As a recipient of Fáilte Ireland's Destination Town Funding, Ms Mangan attended a Fáilte Ireland workshop, *Maximising Your Destination Town Project* which provided guidance around best practice for visitor focussed destination towns to help unlock their potential.

A full board meeting was held in July with a progress report for a tourism recovery plan and task force presented and agreed. Meetings and contracts will be agreed with relevant agencies throughout July/August.

There were ongoing online meetings and calls supporting tourism providers and members in the county.

Ms Mangan visited a number of stakeholders throughout the county. Social media activity and engagement stayed steady throughout the month of July and August highlighting various businesses and announcing the reopening of their doors/premises. Blog posts were created, including 'Girls Just Wanna Have Fun... Kildare Style!!', '5 Gems in Kildare You Won't Find in a Guide Book', 'Best Travel 'Splurges' in Kildare', and 'Best Places in Kildare for Epic Lads Getaway'. All these items received very high engagement rates through social media channels.

Sponsorship of Tattersalls Gold Cup included an advert in the digital race card as well as signage in the parade ring. Also an ad was placed in the digital race card for Keenland Day, The Summer Festival.

Ms Mangan attended a site visit of Ummeras Bog with the Ummeras Community Development Group where they are proposing to develop a Peatlands Park.

Kildare Fáilte completed their Fáilte Ireland Infection Prevention Control for a Tourism Business Course and has received the Fáilte Ireland Safety Charter Certificate.

Work commenced on the Digital Directory for members, which is COVID-19 friendly. This directory will highlight to visitors, and potential visitors, all that Kildare has to offer as well as the opportunity to book



accommodation or an admission ticket in advance of their visit. They will also have the option to purchase a gift voucher following their stay to drive additional visitation to the county.

Initial meetings were held with the designer of the new tourism information pack and the first photoshoot for this took place in August. Subsequent photoshoots are being planned for September and October.

As part of the working group for the Royal Canal Greenway, Kildare Fáilte attended meetings to discuss marketing activities for a soft launch in October. Kildare Fáilte is working with Kildare County Council on production of the trailhead and storyboards. The Kildare Destination Recovery Task Force met, as requested by Fáilte Ireland. Representatives from each sector of the tourism industry and stakeholders attended. Following this meeting, a meeting was arranged with Kildare members of the Oireachtas, Seanad, Mr Carey, Chief Executive of Kildare County Council and Ms

Catherine Martin, TD, Minister for Media, Tourism, Arts, Culture, Sport and the Gaeltacht. As a result of the meeting, additional funding was secured for Kildare to develop a recovery marketing campaign through Fáilte Ireland.

The Chief Executive Officer of Into Kildare took part in weekly meetings with the Economic Recovery Taskforce, which was established to update and communicate during the restrictions in Kildare.

In August, a campaign to promote Kildare to locals was launched – Be a Tourist in Your Own County. This was supported through local radio, print ads in local press and social media. blog topics were: We Care in Kildare for Local Attractions, Be a Tourist in Your Own County and Get Outdoors in Kildare, The Ultimate Guide to Kildare Take Out Dining, Be a Tourist in Your Own County. We Care in Kildare tagline campaign continued. Ms Mangan also completed several interviews including RTE Radio 1 News, local radio and a local podcast.



Parks

Sallins Amenity Land

Cathal O'Meara, Landscape Architects have been appointed to prepare a masterplan for Sallins Amenity Land. They are scheduled to start the work at the end of the month. It is hoped to have a preliminary design prepared by Christmas and a Part 8 for the lands advertised in April 2021.

Open Space Strategy

Work on the preparation of an Open Space Strategy has been ongoing since April in conjunction with the Planning Department. Work to date has involved an analysis of existing parks, playgrounds and open spaces in the county. It also includes recording the location of other areas of publically accessible open space provided by other state agencies, semi state agencies sports clubs and sporting organisations. An audit of existing parks within the county is also ongoing. Consultation on the preparation of the strategy commenced on 10 September. This will be done using an online

questionnaire on the council's website for the public, sports clubs and schools. Specific consultation workshops are also being organised for Councillors and other stakeholders in early October. The online public consultation will start 10 September and run until the 22 October. Full details of this will be provided through a press release and social media.

Tree Surgery Works

Work has been completed in the Celbridge-Leixlip Municipal District. Works in the Athy Municipal District, Kildare-Newbridge and Clane -Maynooth Municipal District will be complete by the end of the month.

Castledermot Playground

Work has started on phase 1 of the masterplan for Fairgreen which involves the installation of a new entrance area to Fairgreen. This is expected to take 8 weeks. Construction of the playground will follow this work.



Allenwood Playground

Work is continuing on the revised Part 8 for the playground and it is planned to advertise it by the end of October.

Anti-dumping Initiative

Works on clearing areas of dumping in Silleachain Lane, Leixlip and Woodstock Castle, Athy have been completed. Medieval Garden, Kildare Town Initial archaeology has been carried out on the site and completion of this work is expected by the end of the month.

Moat of Ardscull

A contractor has been appointed to carry out improvement works here. This will involve clearing back the existing paths, increasing the size of the wildflower meadow in the area and planting 250k spring bulbs which will also benefit pollinators. It is hoped the works will be completed by the end of October.

Your Library, Our Future Kildare Library Service Online Survey

Kildare Library Service has published an online survey on the Kildare County Council Public Consultation Portal. The purpose of this online public consultation is to hear from users and non-library users of Kildare Library Service in order to help the Library Service plan for their library spaces, services and programmes for the coming years.

The feedback received will inform the next Kildare Library Service Development Plan and the new libraries planned for Naas and Clane. To date the council has had over 450 completed surveys and it will remain open for responses until Friday 11 September.

The projects involved inter-agency work between the library service, Kildare Children and Young People's Services Committees (CYPSC), The Curragh Girl's School, Newbridge Family Resource Centre, Kildare Arts Service and St. John of Gods.



Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) Funding for Small Scale Capital Works

The Library Service has applied for funding in response to the above call for proposals. The Library Service are seeking the maximum award of €100,000 to undertake renovation works and energy upgrades in library buildings.

Summer Stars Reading Challenge 2020

July and August were busy months in Kildare Libraries with a jam packed programme of events and workshops for the Summer Stars reading challenge. The programme was run entirely online with children logging into the workshops via a tablet, laptop or PC. In the current situation this allowed the programming to take place in a safe and secure environment until such time as in-branch programming can resume.

The Library Service hosted a broad range of workshops which included coding camps, creative writing workshops, music exploration workshops, podcasting camps, a screenwriting workshop, a Harry Potter science camp, a Science, Technology, Engineering, and MathS (STEAM) camp, a digital animation camp, environmental awareness workshops and a book clinic with Children's Books Ireland. The workshops were held both as single workshops and as camps spanning over several days. They offered children invaluable access to a range of activities and learning opportunities.

In total 38 workshops were held over the summer and 168 individual children attended from across the county. The feedback from parents was extremely positive and the Library received comments applauding the 'great opportunity to learn something new and interesting' 'the great resource for my children during COVID-19 or indeed any time' and the 'lovely events that kept my children engaged and productive'.

An online Summer Stars Closing Party will take place on Kildare Libraries Facebook Page on 12 September and children will be encouraged to collect



their Summer Stars certificate and medal in a goodie bag from 14 September.

Kildare Readers Festival 2020

This year's Kildare Readers Festival will take place online between 12-18 October. The Library Service look forward to welcoming audiences to the authors with regular favourites such as Ten Books You Should Read, the Sunday Morning Session with Mr Dermot Bolger and award-winning novelist, playwright and short story writer Ms Christine Dwyer Hickey. The Library Service look forward to conversations between debut novelist Mr Naoise Dolan and Ms Edel Coffey, Kildare authors Ms Cauvery Madhavan and Ms Margaret Scott, best-selling adult and children's author Ms Marita Conlon-McKenna, Irish Times journalist and author Mr Patrick Freyne, with more to come.

Naas Library

In August, Naas Library launched 'Naas Library Photography Club' for Naas Library members. It is a local club, aimed at beginners and people who wish to improve their photographic skills.

Presently, it is an online venture using Flickr with plans for online video workshops, Questions and Answers and tips on how to get the most from a camera/smartphone.

Naas Library Walkthrough Video Naas Library Walkthrough Video proved very popular online. It was created to simplify the experience of visiting the library during the COVID-19 phase and offered guidance on how to manage Kildare Libraries Booking System and most importantly demonstrated how to keep safe while in the library.



Kildare Town

Heritage Week 15 – 23 August 2020 - "Heritage and Education -Learning from our Heritage" Grab and Go bags for children with heritage-themed books and craft to make at home including colouring sheets with Medieval letters. The Viking Ship is on display and Medieval flags depicting the Fitzgerald Dynasty, The Knights Templar, etc. from the period. Staff wore costumes to celebrate the Medieval Festival (which had to be cancelled this year unfortunately due to COVID-19 restrictions). There was a video loop showing in-branch of the Legends of Kildare (on loan from the Heritage Centre).

Newbridge Library

Newbridge Library has been reaching out to primary schools around Newbridge to offer support in the new climate. It is offering block loan cards, pre-packed book packs of general or project themed books (these can be collected or delivered) and virtual class inductions.

Newbridge Library has an exciting online talk coming up in September with Ms Patrick Hunt on common Irish garden birds which will be delivered online and will be suitable for adults and children alike.

Newbridge Library is working hard on the STEAM programme which supports the primary school Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) curriculum and gives classes across the county the opportunity to engage with science, technology, engineering, arts and maths subjects through our exciting workshops. Staff are working on



transitioning the programme online so that all the workshops can be delivered remotely to classes in a safe environment. Many will still be delivered live and the focus will be on keeping the engaging, exploratory aspect but in a safe and accessible environment.

Naas Library and Cultural Centre

On 26 June the Department of Rural and Community Development issued the Stage 4 Approval for Naas Library and Cultural Centre, Naas Town Hall. COVID-19 has impacted the tender process and caused a delay to the project.

Under instruction from the Office of Government Procurement (OGP) the council currently awaiting external procurement advice which it expects to confirm that it can issue letters to successful and unsuccessful tenders to contractors shortly.

Once the standstill period ends, the Library Service hope to sign the contract with the winning tenderer and progress the project to the construction phase in the coming weeks. Local Studies, Genealogy and **Archives Department** County Kildare Decade of **Commemorations Committee** Articles on War of Independence During August 1920 Several articles appeared in the three local newspapers in recent weeks, detailing events that took place in County Kildare one hundred years ago. These included the Kill Ambush by the Irish Republican Army (IRA) and looting of Naas by the Black and Tans in August 1920. These articles, written by historian and member of staff in Local Studies Department Mr James Durney, have also been published on www.kildare.ie/ehistory and on social media. The role of Curragh Internment Camp during the War of Independence also featured in the local media, including a piece on KFM Radio station.



4th Irish Military Seminar (Online Videos) & Bloody Sunday November 1920

The ongoing Pandemic resulted in the postponement of the 4th Irish Military Seminar scheduled to take place in Riverbank Arts Centre in June. The seminar has now migrated to an online only format, with interviews with well-known historians. Ms Liz Gillis on **Revolutionary Women, Mr James** Durney on the Curragh Internment Camps, Mr Michael Murphy on Terror in Kildare and Mr Michael Foley on the events of Bloody Sunday in Croke Park are all being interviewed. All interviews will be broadcast online on the Kildare Decade of Commemoration's social media and YouTube channel.

Recent Publication of Kildare The Irish Revolution, 1912-23 by Dr Seamus Cullen Four Courts Press have just published the Kildare volume of their Irish Revolution series. Donadea historian

Dr Seamus Cullen is the author of this important publication. The committee have written to Mr Cullen to congratulate him and to invite him to participate in the Decade of Commemorations Programme for County Kildare over the coming months and years.

The Heritage of Education in County Kildare and Recent Passing of **Desmond Guinness** Digitised content was added to www.kildare.ie/ehistory during Heritage Week to highlighted the educational heritage of County Kildare. A 1950's booklet on the churches and schools of Rathangan was digitised, while Maynooth Local History Group added an article on charter schools in the county. Digital images were shared on the library social media pages. A post has also been added to www.kildare.ie/ehistory, including digitised images from items in the collections, to mark the passing of Mr Desmond Guinness who made an immense contribution to the conservation of buildings throughout Ireland including Castletown in Celbridge.



Archive of the Medlicott Family of Dunmurray Acquired

The County Kildare Local Studies and Archives recently acquired an archive of material belonging to the Medlicott Family of Dunmurray at auction. The archive primarily consists of diaries, letters and accounts books from the 1850-1950 period. An auction catalogue of the sale of Moore Abbey in 1937 by Count John McCormack was also acquired. These items of strong cultural heritage interest to Kildare will be catalogued and made available for researchers in the Local Studies and Archives Department of Kildare Library Service in Newbridge.

ISL Visual Art and Virtual ISL Festival Athy

Over the last number of years, Athy Sing and Sign have organised an Irish Sign Language (ISL) Festival every September, funded through Kildare County Council's Creative Ireland programme. Due to COVID-19, the Festival was reimagined into a Visual and Virtual ISL Festival this year.

The visual arts component includes a new mural, by acclaimed street artist Solus Art, Mr Derek O'Sullivan which was installed in Athy in early September 2020. Explaining the mural, Solus said that he likes to balance strength and beauty together hence the ballerina and the boxing gloves, a symbol of overcoming obstacles. "I like to think that this mural will uplift each and every one of us and remind us that we are strong women and men and that we shall all

overcome our common obstacle in society today and that is COVID-19." The ballerina wears a hearing aid and the mural is accompanied by the word 'strong' in text and Irish Sign Language (ISL) Alphabet.

On Culture Night, an independent panel will select a name for the ISL ballerina and pick from the 'Strike a Pose' competition entries. The two winning entries will receive a signed print of the artwork by Solus.

Kildare Culture Night 18 September

This Culture Night a selected and unique programme of events will take place across county Kildare. Many local artists, venues and community groups have responded to Kildare Arts Service call, despite the challenge the COVID-19 Pandemic represents. Encouraged by their enthusiasm, Kildare County Council Art's Service hope that this year's programme will highlight the importance and value of the council's creative sector, in all its artforms. From music gigs to visual art exhibitions, craft workshops and theatre plays, the list includes over 40 free online and offline events; anyone will have a chance to take part safely as all events will strictly follow HSE and Government Guidelines.

Fill it however you wish, capturing the COVID-19 months in some way, and return it to the Library Service for digital scanning, to become part of a permanent archive for Kildare County Council, before the notebook is returned to the participant for keeping.

A well as the digital archiving, there was a desire to somehow share the project with participants and the public in a safe manner, as a public exhibition of the notebooks is not appropriate at this time.

Funding was secured under Creative Ireland's Positive Ageing and Creative Wellbeing Challenge Fund to create a documentary, with some of the older notebook participants, for online screening on Culture Night, 18 September on Kildare Art's Service social media channels. Recording a selected number of participants on the film, in their own home, talking about their notebooks will add another layer to the project. 7 participants have been selected from across the county. Kildare County Council LEO Working with Government throughout Kildare Lockdown The month of August saw the announcement of two additional local lockdowns for Kildare. Kildare County Council's LEO worked through the crisis extensively with the Tánaiste, Minister for Enterprise Trade and Employment, Mr Leo Varadkar, the Department of Business Enterprise and Innovation and the Kildare Chamber of Commerce to ensure Kildare businesses were provided with additional supports.

After gathering feedback form the Kildare businesses community, the Kildare LEO provided a list of recommendations to the Government for further measures which could be implemented to facilitate sectors in continuing to trade in the county under restrictions while still adhering to COVID-19 safety guidelines.

Outcomes:

- An additional 20% top up (in addition to orgianal 20%) – increasing the Restart Grant to 40%.
- €330,000 in additional funding for LEO supports.
- The relaunch of trading on line vouchers 90% funding to value of €2,500 to bring business on line, specific focus on tourism sectors.
- 4. Reopening of Micro Finance Funding.
- 5. Expandsion of the Credit Guarantee Scheme.





 During the second lockdown period 178 one on one business interventions were made, 24 emergency interventions which will involve a programme of supports to get them through.

COVID-19 and Entrepreneurship Support Services

Kildare County Council LEO Host 250+ Businesses at Information Webinar Relating to all Government Supports

Kildare County Council LEO organised, promoted and delivered an information webinar featuring eight speakers from Government Bodies for over 250 business owners. The delivery of this project was within 3 days of the national announcement by the Department of Business Enterprise and Innovation. The interactive webinar focused on providing information to help businesses stabilise and adapt in preparation for getting back on the road to recovery. It discussed the changes and updates to the temporary wage subsidy, Government financial supports and sources of finance to ensure as many business in Kildare were made fully aware of supports available to them.

Economic Development - Capital Projects MERITS

The completion of the MERITS (Mid-East Region Innovation Think Space) building in Naas will realise a vision to serve the emerging technology sector by connecting organisations and people and acting as a centre of excellence in supporting innovative companies across the county and wider region.

MERITS is currently building its network of partners and members. The facility will be an ideal location for High Potential Start Up companies looking for a vibrant, interactive workspace, which is already networked into an array of supports (as provided by the LEO) and key stakeholders. It will also cater for larger companies seeking to place a smaller project team into a creative environment where conceptualisation can be turned into commercialisation.





A site visit took place last week to see the progress onsite. The site visit was hosted by main contractor Duggan Lynch and involved Mr Carey, Chief Executive, Kildare County Council, Mr John Daly Project Manager, Mr Conor Sweeney, Programme Manager, Ms Sharon O'Gara, Planning Department, Kildare County Council and the new MERITS General Manager Mr Joe O'Carroll.

Mr Joe O'Carroll, a native of Kildare, started as General Manager of MERITS at the beginning of the month and has travelled the "StartUp, ScaleUp, Exit" journey with his own companies previously. He will oversee its transition from construction project to its operational phase. He has begun marketing the facility to select technology startups in the region and will also now begin recruitment for a Programme Manager.

Equine Tech Innovation Hub

Through the structure of the County Kildare Community Network (CKCN) the LEO of Kildare county Council plans the establishment of Equine Tech Innovation Ireland as a sectoral stimulus to develop an equine innovation hub of enterprise, innovation, applied research, commercialisation and learning. Uniquely, it will offer a single access source of equine technical and entrepreneurial innovation.

Ms McNabb, Head of Enterprise, submitted an application for preapproval of funding to Leader for € 87,821.25 (75% allowed based on costs) and this has been approved pending certain conditions. The CKCN tendered for the conversion of the Museum Building (143m2) to offices at the Irish National Stud on Monday 29 June. The tender process has been completed and the report has been finalised and the LEO will be in a position to appoint a contractor once the council receive final approval from the County Kildare LEADER Partnership at the end of September.

Athy Food, Drink

and Skills Innovation Hub In 2019 Kildare County Council was the benefactor of €500,000 from Coca Cola on their departure from Athy as a contribution towards the development of the Old Model School in Athy into the Food, Drink and Skills Innovation Hub.





The CKCN/Kildare County Council was awarded €476,250.00 under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF) Category 2 funding to support the appointment of an architect led design team to perform professional services for the delivery of the Athy Food, Drink and Skills Innovation Hub.

The CKCN/Kildare County Council tendered for the contract on 16 June to engage a consultant comprising a multi-disciplined competent and suitably experienced architect led design team to provide relevant consultancy services in respect of the design and delivery of the Athy Food, Drink and Skills Innovation Hub. The tender report has been completed and a design team will be appointed by the middle of September. The LEO are also in the process of preparing an application for Category 1 RRDF funding.
