That the elected members support new and existing groups in County Kildare that welcome displaced persons, and the council highlights the partnerships and services available to empower inclusive communities responding to the challenge.

Furthermore, that the elected members endorse the Irish Refugee Council's recommendation to appoint a national refugee response director to coordinate increased investment in suitable accommodation with trained personnel and appropriate support.

Recognising the enormous efforts of the housing section and the targets being met, that the council provide a report on the projected number of housing acquisitions for 2023 to 2025 and a breakdown of the mechanism for their delivery.

That the council provide a report on projected costs for addressing outstanding issues in estates not taken in charge, what provisions are there to meet these costs and considering the level of construction activity in the county at present, what means are being deployed to prevent similar levels of issues arising in the future.
