The 2022 Annual Report reflects on the activities and achievements of Kildare County Council as well as highlighting the wide range of services provided by the local authority in Kildare, across all aspects of daily life.

Communications Campaign to highlight Impact and Contribution of 2022 Local Property Tax Funding



Kildare County Council published an overview of the extensive contribution and impact of Local Property Tax funding in 2022. As part of the extensive communications campaign, an information video and podcast were published featuring contributions from many groups and individuals across the County highlighted some of the projects and initiatives that benefitted from LPT funding last year. The aim of the campaign is to increase awareness and understanding of 'where your local property tax is going', how it is allocated and how all communities are benefiting.

To date the information video has over 1,000 views and the podcast has almost 400 listens and reach of over 47,000 on social media posts for the campaign.



As Members are aware the budget in the public sector represents the ceiling to funding provision of a service – ie excluding additional grants, the budget amount is the maximum spend that can be incurred.

Estimates are fixed and service delivery is limited to within the envelope of funding. If a budget holder wants/needs to increase some aspect of the service beyond the budget provision, they need to find the funding elsewhere by reducing some other line of expenditure.

The executive is very conscious of the need to monitor and manage expenditure and to ensure that overall budgets are not exceeded whilst at the same time delivering services in accordance with the budget agreed by Members.

Revenue expenditure is currently running at 51% - this is slightly ahead of budget as it includes savings in the non-spend of Retained LPT, however senior management will continue to review this situation to ensure the year out-turns on target.

As advised in the June Chief Executive Report an Evaluation Committee, made up of internal and external members, was scheduled to meet following Kildare County Council's 'Call for Ideas' with staff – this committee has now met and members were very impressed with the number, diversity and creativity of the ideas received from staff.

The ideas fell into three broad categories:

- Initiatives that are already complete or in progress
- Initiatives that require a more national approach e.g. change in legislation.
- Initiatives to progress to the next phase

The ideas in the third category can be mainly categorised as **Quick Wins** (i.e. ideas that once implemented can bring a lot of value and can be easily realised) and **Major Projects** (i.e. ideas that would bring great value but more significant resources are needed to implement them successfully). The next step is to agree Phase one with Se Management Team. This will be a balanced portfolio of projects i.e. a mix of **Quick Wins** and **Major**

Projects to progress to the next stage and will look to delivering a number of these projects over the coming months.

Housing and Regeneration

Housing

Town Centre Living Architectural Design Competition

The 'Town Centre Living' competition, launched on 27 January 2023, aims to encourage innovative designs from architectural firms for social housing within town centres and progress the



Town Centre First policy. On 14 June last, Minister Darragh O'Brien announced the winning proposals and the scheme at Station Road, Kildare Town was chosen as one of the four winning entries, from 114 entries. The Stage one application for the site is being prepared for submission to DHLGH.



Summary of Social Housing Assessments - SSHA

Local authorities have been asked to prepare a summary of social housing assessments (under Section.21 of the Housing (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2009) in their respective administrative areas. The Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage has directed that the Summary for 2023 be prepared on 1 November 2023 for return on or before 29 November 2023. Local authority, HAP, RAS or transfer tenants are not included in this assessment.

Homeless Services Cost Rental Tenant in Situ Scheme (CRTiS)

The Council has submitted one CRTiS application to the Housing Agency.

Homeless Outreach

Street work was completed in Kildare-Newbridge Municipal District, Naas Municipal District and Athy Municipal District. National Quality Standard Framework inspections were completed in Kerdiffstown House and Jigginstown Manor. The Outreach Team attended meetings with Mount Offaly House, Naas Hospital, HSE Addiction Team, ARAS, Heads Up Programme and Cuan Mhuire. Outreach provided Homeless outreach clinics in the Ballymakealy Community Centre, Celbridge and Newbridge Family Resource Centre. Seventeen single homeless clients exited emergency accommodation in June.

Tenancy Sustainment

At present there are 55 active tenancy sustainment cases, with 44 on the waiting list and two successful discharges in June. Sustainment Officers have engaged in 2 housing clinics, in the Prosperous Family Hub and Athy Family Hub.





Emergency Accommodation

Homeless Services had secured the use of 15 emergency rooms in The Gables, Newbridge. Ownership of this building recently changed and as a result alternative accommodation was secured for people placed in this hotel.

Eighty-one (81) applications have been received for the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant.

Town Centre First (TCF)

Consultants have been appointed to prepare a plan for Clane Town Centre under the Town TCF policy.

Housing Allocations

For the period January 2023 to June 2023, the council allocated a total of 607 properties throughout the county. 265 were Council properties and 342 were AHB properties. This is 151 units more than in June 2022. Among the locations that allocations took place were Newbridge, Athy, Leixlip, Naas and Kildare Town. In an effort to address the number of refusals of offers of allocation, the use of Choice Based Letting (CBL) has been increased.

Kildare County Council held a number of public events as part of National Food Waste Recycling Week. An awareness campaign on using brown bins properly was underpinned by three kitchen caddy distribution events in Athy, Celbridge and Naas. Over 1,500 caddies were distributed and the events were very well received by the public.

GAA Green Clubs Initiative



Cappagh GAA club is the pilot club for Kildare for this national initiative.

The next phase of the project involves reducing waste arisings within the clubhouse and work on this is proceeding.

New Initiatives – Civic Amenity Site North – Near Celbridge

A Market Sounding exercise took place in late 2022. An update on the findings was presented to the Celbridge/Leixlip Municipal District in March. Capital funding is the key



challenge delaying the delivery of this project.

Online Training

This new version is being rolled out by all Local Authority training departments, with assistance from the Local Authority Services National Training Group (LASNTG), from the 1 March 2023.







Thematic Training

Training under this pillar responds to identified training needs of specific local authority groupings. Other training courses under this pillar are at various stages of design and progression towards delivery, including training aimed at/focusing on the Older Persons Council, Economic/Enterprise Opportunities and Roads Infrastructure.



Outdoor Staff

This training focuses on outdoor staff in local authorities, with trainers working on behalf of the Local Authority Services National Training Group and commenced in January 2023.



Frontline Staff

This training is targeting staff of local authorities who are front line or community-facing and will be delivered in person by the Institute of Public

Administration (IPA) and Local
Authority Services National Training
Group (LASNTG), who will coordinate
with training officers in local authorities
to make registration arrangements.
The programme was piloted in March
2022 and rolled out across the CARO
regions over the year, before opening
to all local authorities in October /
November.



Local Authority Climate Action Plans (LA CAP)

The Minister has approved a business case for local authority climate action resources in respect of two roles. A letter of comfort has been issued by the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications (DECC), relating to the recruitment of these resources on a five-year term for the purposes of developing and implementing the LA CAP as aligned with the provisions of the business case.

The Climate Action Plan 2023 was published by the Minister on the 21 December 2022 with the Annex of Actions published in March 2023.



On 24 February 2023, the Minister issued instructions to all Local Authorities to commence the process of preparing the Local Authority Climate Action Plan (LACAP).

The Minister has set a date of 23 February 2024 to finalise the plans plus one month for publication.

The team is working towards adoption by Full Council in November/December 2023 to enable the plan to be launched by January 2024.

Local Authority Progress Reporting
– Climate Adaptation Strategies:
Annual reporting on progress of the implementation of Local Authority
Climate Adaptation Strategies / Plans has been undertaken by all Climate
Action Officers/Leads in all local authorities. A sectoral report is being collated by CARO for submission to the Department.



Sub-Regional Energy Projects
The CARO are working with local
authorities in each of the four subregions to develop regional energy

bureaus or regional energy efficiency projects.

In the Mid-East, the three local authorities involved (Kildare, Meath, Wicklow) with the assistance of CARO, are in the process of finalising a contract with Codema to provide an energy service for local authorities in this sub-region.

In the Border sub-region (Cavan, Monaghan, Leitrim): A tender for a public building energy efficiency report resulted in Codex Energy being appointed. Their final report identifies 18 buildings with a project pipeline of over 100 potential projects for each building to attain a B2 rating.

In the Southeast (Kilkenny, Carlow, Wexford, Waterford, Tipperary): The four Directors of Carlow, Waterford, Wexford and Kilkenny, have instructed the South East Energy Agency (formerly 3CEA) to pursue Pathfinder Support.

In the Midlands (Laois, Offaly,
Longford, Roscommon, Westmeath):
Roscommon County Council has
become the fifth member of the
Midlands Energy Agency (MEA). The
MEA local authorities, with the support
of SEAI, have formed a working group





to focus on pursuing Pathfinder Capital Support.



Reimagining Local Authority Fleet

The vision of this project is to develop a pathway for decarbonizing local authority fleet with a view to realizing emission reduction and energy efficiency targets. The sector has one of the largest fleets with approx. 6,500 vehicles.

CARO are examining the development of a number of local authority case studies to support the solutions identified, including a HVO trial undertaken in Tipperary and Galway City; transition to EVs in Cork City and Dublin City; as well as fleet management and eco driver training undertaken in Donegal.



Development of Local Authority Key Performance Indicators on Climate Action

In light of the evolving policy context of climate action and increased ambition for the local government sector, the County and City Managers Association (CCMA) Climate Action and Transport Network (CATN) committee endorsed convening of a KPI working group to achieve specific objectives. This working group, chaired by Paul Kennedy of Dún-Laoghaire Rathdown Council, will work with a number of local authorities across the country, with the intention to have KPIs decided upon and tested to align with the implementation stage of Local Authority Climate Action Plans (LACAPs).

GAA / CCMA Green Clubs Programme:



Phase one of the Green Club

The programme successfully secured €100,000 funding through Strand two

of the Community Climate Action
Fund. These funds will be used to

The Decarbonising Zone actions plan will also inform the Maynooth joint Local Area Plan (LAP) Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) and other policies.

The event was attended by approximately 2,000 people and took place on the 18 June, 2023



The Mid East Energy Unit



The three local authorities of Wicklow, Meath and Kildare County Councils have come together to address their combined climate mitigation ambitions through the formation of the Mid East Energy Unit. Kildare County Council signed a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the lead Local authority Wicklow County Council in December. The formation of the unit is to support the three Local Authorities to meet their 2030 energy efficiency and carbon emissions targets and show leadership and CODEMA will provide core services to the local authorities associated.

The unit will combine efforts to effect change utilising the SEAI's Pathfinder funding scheme to provide finance support for defined projects through a register of opportunities being developed.

Climate Action SPC:

The scheduled meeting on 10 May took place.and two presentations were given. The first by Teagasc on the Signpost programme which is in keeping with a bespoke DZ for individual farms. This was followed by a presentation on the approved CA SPC workplan and an overview of the LA CAP and DZ. The next meeting is scheduled for 13 September 2023.





Sustainable Energy Communities (SEC's)



Kildare County Council continues to make good progress on Sustainable Energy Communities (SEC) in the county. The number of SEC's continues to grow. There are currently 29 SEAI registered SEC's in county Kildare.

The number of SECs (Sustainable Energy Communities) in the county continues to grow and there are currently 29 SEAI registered SEC's in County Kildare. Kilcock have completed their Energy Masterplan and Ballymore Eustace are progressing theirs.

The SEC's of Monasterevin, Clane,
Kilcullen and Maynooth undertook an
activation program under the
stewardship of the Energy Team, a
community enterprise formed from
Dunleer SEC, to advance building
retrofits successfully under the SEAI
retrofit fund. Technical Assessments
are well advanced and the application

to the SEAI will advance when the appropriate funding round opens.



Alternative Fuel of the Council's Fleet

The CCMA has recently published its
Electric Vehicle (EV) Guidance
Document for Local Authorities;
The Climate Action Office is
examining the potential to introduce a
compressed natural gas heavy goods
vehicle into Kildare County Council's
fleet with mechanical services, while
smaller vans have suitable options
such as electrification; the larger trucks
are an issue. One solution to this is a
compressed natural gas vehicle.
Presently the installation of a pumping
station at the New Hall Depot is being
progressed.

Disability Participation and Awareness Fund 2021





An Roinn Leanaí, Comhionannais, Míchumais, Lánpháirtíochta agus Óige Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth

The successful implementation of Gnáthóga Nádúrtha (Natural Habitats) - initiative as part of the Arts Council's Invitation to Collaboration scheme is nearing completion.

€75,000 has been awarded under the Creative Ireland's Climate Action: Invitation to Collaboratively fund an application, led by Carlow County Council, in conjunction with Kildare and Meath County Councils. It is an ambitious arts led inquiry, an interdisciplinary, collaborative intervention, sited across three natural heritage peatland habitats in Carlow, Kildare and Meath that brings the urgency of climate action to the forefront.

Other Initiatives

'Stitching the Community Together'

The Climate Action Office, Community and Libraries section were successful in attaining just over €30,000 in funding from Creative Ireland for the project 'Stitching the Community Together'. The project is based on intergenerational art project centered around the medium of wool and

knitting and will include three elements to the project: intergenerational workshop on wool and knitting between nursing homes and schools, virtual reality (VR) educational piece to explore the 'Farm-to-Fleece' process of wool co-created with students and an exhibition phase showcasing the work.

Gas Innovation Fund and Public Service Innovation Fund



The Climate Action Office is reapplying for the Gas Network Ireland's Gas Innovation Fund in conjunction with Maynooth University's Terrain-Ai research group and Teagasc. This project aims to assess the potential for green spaces to generate biomass e.g., grass-clippings as a feedstock for energy generation in Kildare with potential of scaling the study up to different county councils and state bodies nationwide. If successful the main body of work will be carried out with project support from the Climate Action Office, Maynooth University and engagement with Teagasc.







To advance the project financially an application was made to the Public Service Innovation Fund 2023 the bid has been successful and funding of €50,000 is to be awarded on signing of Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) An agreement is now being formulated with Maynooth University to enable the research to commence at pace. It is expected that the project will be completed by Quarter two/three of 2024.

Local Economic and Community

This was the result of extensive preparation through analysis of data, policies and current plans. A copy of the socio-economic statement has been circulated to all elected members. Consultation is now commencing to determine the views of various stakeholders on the draft vision/high level goals. This will also outline priority actions for inclusion in the plan. A collaborative approach with Kildare Public Participation Network (PPN) who are also developing a plan

is underway. Five meetings across the county targeting voluntary community groups are taking place to gather views to feed into the LECP and PPN plans. Details have been circulated. A survey targeting the general public will be circulated in the coming weeks. Consultations are also planned with local businesses, statutory bodies, voluntary sector organisations and elected members in the coming months. It is anticipated that the plan will be finalised before the end of the year.

Kildare County Development Plan 2023-2029:








