That the council take measures to alleviate the flooding outside the house at (details provided) as it is causing serious damage to this property.

That the council investigate and propose low cost and temporary/pilot active travel upgrades in Maynooth, particularly making use of existing infrastructure in the Newtown Road, Old Greenfield and Dublin Road area, to address problem areas not covered by 2023 plans.
