**5. Motion – Councillor Paul Ward**

That the council contact KPMG to request them to undertake work to improve the current unsatisfactory appearance and condition of the vacant commercial site in Chambers Park, Kilcock and to request an update from them on the timeline for the commencement of sale process of these units.

**6. Motion – Councillor Teresa Murray**

That the council report on the housing estates in the Maynooth Municipal District where developers have sold private parking spaces within public open space amenities and the implications involved for the taking in charge process.
