Roads, Transportation and Public Safety (3:35 p.m.)

3. Motion – Councillor Moore

That Kildare County Council now consider that in promoting 'more leisure cycling activities' that pedestrians, particularly the frail, elderly, recuperating, children and those with hearing, walking and sight difficulties and who feel they are walking in a safe environment on footpaths at the areas of the Naas lakes, open parks, town centre or residential footpath areas, be more fully protected by 'No Cycling Allowed' public notices and by requesting the An Garda Síochána to be more vigilant to the abuse of 'footpath cycling' by cyclists of all ages and all times of the day.
