**7. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear**

That the council commence the review of the Naas Parking bye laws as it is now past the mid-term point of the current bye laws.

**8. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear**

That the council request the National Transport Authority to install two bus shelters, one at Naas Hospital and the other on the Dublin Road at the entrance to Roseville as these are busy stops and are very exposed to the elements.

**9. Motion – Councillor Fintan Brett**

That the council carry out repairs to a gully on the Castlewarden Road (left hand side) about 80 metres from the Golf Club entrance.

**10. Motion – Councillor Evie Sammon**

That the council apply to the Low Cost Safety Improvement Scheme for Watch House Cross on the R411/L2023.

**11. Motion – Councillor Evie Sammon**

That the council cost the undergrounding of the overhead cables on Chapel Street, Ballymore Eustace.
