That the council install an uncontrolled or controlled crossing with beacons on the Southern Ring Road at the Rathasker Road intersection to facilitate the increase in walkers using this route since Covid-19.

That the council installs a yellow box at the entrance to the Craddockstown Walk Estate junction on the Craddockstown Road.

That for safety reasons, the council installs the extra bollards needed to fill the gap, stretching from the corner at the entrance to Stoneleigh Estate to meet the existing bollards in front of the Community School.
