5. **Motion – Councillor Fintan Brett**
That the council update members on proposed works within the municipal district over the next year, especially with regards to footpath and road restoration, in order to assist in the disposal of discretionary LPT funding.
6. **Motion – Councillor Carmel Kelly**
That the council update/renew Stencils on footpaths and areas most frequented by dog walkers to remind dog owners to “bin the poop”.



7. Motion – Councillor Carmel Kelly

That this council liaise with Waterways Ireland to install temporary audio warning devices along the Grand Canal in this municipal district to remind dog owners of their responsibilities.

8. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That the council examine the possibility of installing a pedestrian crossing between Castle Farm/Primrose Gardens across the ring road to Elsmore pedestrian entrance.

9. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That the council install double yellow lines for 30 meters at Oakglade Close to prevent parents, who are collecting from Naas Community National School, from blocking the junction.

10. Motion – Councillor Colm Kenny

That the council review its oversight and audit procedure to ensure appropriate standard of reinstatement is achieved in this municipal district following repairs and resurfacing by contractors and utility companies e.g. the recent resurfacing on the Rathasker Road and repairs post pipe laying on the Woolpack Road.

That the council provide an update on the provision of Broadband Services in Ballymore Eustace.

That the council upgrade the quality of lighting at Monread Park, Naas, to improve visibility in the interests of safety.

Can the council confirm if it has any plans to provide a controlled crossing on the Craddockstown Road at the raised table crossing point between the Fairgreen and the Ballymore Road Lakes taking into account the increased number of vulnerable road



users (VRU) and elderly pedestrians that walk to Naas General Hospital and exercise around the lakes?

Can the council confirm how often they review the configuration of motion sensor activated traffic lights to ensure the sensor detects lone cyclists so that cyclists obeying the light signal do not have to wait for vehicles to arrive and activate a signal change?

Can the council confirm if it has considered the introduction of Sunflower Parking in the Naas Municipal District?

Can the council confirm when the agreed double yellow lines for St Corban's Place will be installed?

20. **Motion – Councillor Seamie Moore**
That this council issues a letter to the Minister of State with responsibility for the Office of Public Works, Patrick O'Donovan, drawing his attention to the ongoing saga of small financial allocations, being made on a piecemeal basis, to secure and preserve Jigginstown Castle in Naas (1634-1640) as a Building of Architectural and Historic value, long after its selection in the year 2000 as a priority State Project; that could now avail of new Government Grant initiatives and be brought into use as a tourist building of immense interest

Can the council clarify what is required to erect a prominent stone feature on a stand alone site in Naas Town Centre as a testament to Naas winning 'The Cleanest Town in Ireland' IBAL Award and to give perpetual credit to the volunteerism of the Community in Naas?
