That the District Manager undertakes to investigate why the council has failed to fulfil an outstanding agreement with Naas Town Traders to facilitate the removal of Sandwich Boards, Billboards and other Loose Ground Level Signage from Street Pavements and Shop Doorways, that litter the town as hazards, by replacing them with modern street pole signage, using colour backgrounds that identify a) Public Service Premises/Buildings, b) Social and Hospitality Amenities and c) Historical and Heritage Areas around the town.

That the council invite tenders for the provision of a local bike rental scheme in the Naas Municipal District, similar to the Dublin Bike scheme and modelled on similar schemes operating successfully in cities and towns across Europe.
