That the Kildare County Council presents the members of the Naas Municipal District with options to improve visibility of the raised kerbs on the Kilcullen Road, Naas.



7. Motion – Councillor Fintan Brett

That the council installs a pedestrian crossing at the dropped kerbs/tactile paving location on the Ballymore Road, Naas adjacent to Swans to ensure a safe crossing area for pedestrians.

8. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That, given the mounting number of trips, particularly among older people, the council makes safe the Kilcullen Road, Naas by painting the raised kerbs in a more visible colour and providing for the installation of a zebra crossing from Swans to SuperValu.

That the council changes the ramp to a raised platform on the Punchestown Road at Johnstown to alleviate noise pollution in the adjoining cottages.
