- 6. Motion – Councillor Ger Dunne**
That the council provides an accessible parking space on Wolfe Tone Street to allow persons needing this type of parking to have access to the shops in this area.



7. Motion – Councillor Seamie Moore

That, in light of complaints made that the Residential Groups, Courts System and Business Area of Harbour View and Basin Street, Naas are now being turned into a three hundred metres long cul-de-sac and the very possible risk that an unplanned accident or deliberately planned blockage of the only vehicle entrance into the area from the Main Street could isolate and put lives at risk because Fire Brigade, Ambulance, Gardaí, Medical Services or Prison Services Staff would then be unable to access the area, the council should withdraw the Section 38 Closure of its link with Abbey Street, until new developments following from the future adoption of the Master Plan for the Harbour Quarter are commenced.

8. Motion – Councillor Seamie Moore

Following the recent successful festival visit of over 30 boating vessels, organised by members of the Kildare Branch of the Inland Waterways Association of Ireland (IWAI), to Naas Canal Harbour and their inability to access the Corbally Canal beyond the Jigginstown Road culvert, the elected members of Naas Municipal District now again seek to have suitable Consultants undertake a study to evaluate the cost and necessary engineering inputs that will be required to open this 8.5 kilometre waterway to boating and water sports enthusiasts for the future 50,000 population of Naas and an area catchment of 125,000.

9. Motion – Councillor Anne Breen

That the council provides a pedestrian crossing at the junction of Hartwell Road and the Main Road in Kill to deal with the significant increase in vehicular and pedestrian traffic in this area.

10. Motion – Councillor Anne Breen

That the council provides more obvious and tangible signage to clearly indicate that the age friendly parking space near the bus stop on South Main Street is for age friendly parking only by enlarging the existing signage and by adding road surface markings.



11. Motion – Councillor Fintan Brett

That the council examines the feasibility of providing a Park and Ride facility on the lands north of Johnstown Village (between the Johnstown-Kill Slip Road and the N7) part of which lands are in council ownership.

12. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

Once all the autumn leaves have fallen, could Kildare County Council arrange for the road sweeper trucks to carry out a full clean-up across all housing estates within the Naas Municipal District? Many estates experience a heavy build-up of leaves on roads and footpaths at this time of year, which can cause slipping hazards, block drains, and create an untidy appearance. A comprehensive sweep would greatly improve safety, drainage, and the overall presentation of our estates heading into the winter months.

13. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That the council develops a comprehensive plan to extend the Naas-Sallins Greenway fully into Sallins and bring this long-awaited project to completion, incorporating an upgrade of the existing path from Abbey Bridge to the Naas Sports Centre, ensuring it meets modern accessibility and safety standards, thereby encouraging active travel, supporting tourism, and providing a safer, greener connection for commuters, families, and recreational users alike.

14. Motion – Councillor Carmel Kelly

That the council moves immediately to ensure that the situation regarding the parking of non-Irish registered vehicles parking for weeks on end along the canal in Sallins (on designated parking spaces), be rectified.

15. Motion – Councillor Evie Sammon

That the council suspends Pay Parking and the Taxi Rank at Market Square and closes Church Lane on 29 November and 06 December 2025 to facilitate the Christmas Markets and the arrival of Santa Claus in Naas.



16. Motion – Councillor Evie Sammon

That the council brings the speed limits in Ballymore Eustace in line with the village boundary as outlined in the Kildare County Development Plan.

Have the rotten timber bollards, purposely combined with concrete barriers to prevent illegal camping on the Ring Roads around Naas, now not become obsolete for the purpose intended and have instead become road obstructions as they are being illegally removed and discarded and should the council not now consider their entire removal in the interests of road and driver safety?
