5. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That the council writes to the National Transport Authority and/or relevant public transport providers to request the installation of a new bus stop in the vicinity of Esmondale, Naas. At present, there is no designated bus stop between Naas town centre and Pipers Hill, despite the presence of multiple residential estates along this stretch, including Esmondale, Killashee View, and Broadfield View. The addition of a bus stop in this area would significantly improve public transport accessibility for local residents and support sustainable transport options.



6. Motion – Councillor Bill Clear

That, given the significant number of court sittings now taking place, the council installs a solar-powered compactor bin outside Naas Courthouse where local tidy towns volunteers are noticing an increase in litter and are frequently required to pick up rubbish from outside the courthouse.

7. Motion – Councillor Anne Breen

That the council works with the National Transport Authority and service providers for the installation of a new bus stop on the Blessington Road, Naas to facilitate passengers from the many houses/housing estates in this area using Bus Route 183, Arklow to Sallins.

8. Motion – Councillor Anne Breen

That the council looks at installing a traffic light controlled pedestrian crossing at the junction of Wolfe Tone Street and the main Dublin Road, Naas in the interests of pedestrian safety.

9. Motion – Councillor Fintan Brett

That the council in conjunction with Transport Infrastructure Ireland repairs/replaces the damaged sound barrier at Bishops court, Kill.
