A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the team will meet with Councillor Kelly on site to assess the suitability of a location and feasibility of the proposal.

Bus shelters in the municipal district

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Kelly
That the council provide an updated list on the provision of bus shelters in the municipal district.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Kelly and seconded by Councillor Clear.

A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the following bus stop locations have been identified for bus shelter designs in the Naas Municipal District:

Councillor Clear stated that the provision of bus shelters would make a big difference especially as the public were being encouraged to use public transport. He said there was one new bus stop in Sallins and enquired if the council could look at putting a shelter there.

Councillor Brett mentioned that the bus stop in Poplar Square was no longer in use. Councillor Clear advised that this was because the bus companies did not consider the stop to be up to standard.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Kelly, seconded by Councillor Clear and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Bollards from Fr Murphy Place to Hollywood Park Naas

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Breen
That council consider installing bollards along the footpath area from Fr Murphy Place to the traffic lights at Hollywood Park Naas in the interests of the safety of school children from the nearby primary/secondary schools on the Sallins Road.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Breen and seconded by Councillor Brett

A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the footpath on this section of the Sallins Road has limited width. By



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placing bollards along its length, the effective width of the footpath would be further reduced so it is not considered appropriate to provide bollards at this location.

Councillor Breen accepted the report but said that it was very difficult to pass if someone was walking by with a pram/buggy. She accepted that the footpath would be further narrowed by the placement of bollards.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Breen, seconded by Councillor Brett and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Yellow box at the Hartwell Road junction

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Brett
That the council install a yellow box at the Hartwell Road junction in Kill Village.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Brett and seconded by Councillor Sammon.

A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the Naas Municipal District office will assess the provision of a yellow box junction at this location in line with the relevant technical guidance document.

Councillor Brett informed the members that a yellow box would improve traffic flow as currently traffic was unable to move when the lights changed.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Brett, seconded by Councillor Sammon and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Sharks Teeth painting program

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Brett
Can the council advise on the feasibility of carrying out a "sharks teeth" painting program on ramps within our municipal district, where required?



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A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the Naas Municipal District office are undertaking improvements to a number of ramps in the district this year, as part of the current works programme. Due to financial constraints, it is not possible to improve all ramps in the district. If there are any specific locations in mind, the District Engineer would be happy to discuss this with the Councillors.

The report was noted.

Weeds at the lakes at Lakelands/Ballymore

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Breen

That the council investigate the current unacceptable situation with regard to weeds covering the surface of all the lakes at Lakelands/Ballymore Road in Naas, as occurred last year, making it impossible for the waterfowl to use the water as intended.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Breen and seconded by Councillor Kelly.

A report was received from Mr. S Wallace, A/Senior Parks and Landscaping Officer informing the members that an ecologist will be engaged to investigate this, and the findings of their report will be issued to members once completed.

Councillor Breen expressed that she was not happy with the report. She said that it was impossible for ducks and swans to get into the lakes. She asked if the report was back from the ecologist yet? She also stated that she brought this up at a meeting last year and was told it was due to the hot weather at the time.

Councillor Moore stated that he was involved in discussing this item last year and proposed that the council construct a silt trap south of the lakes that could be serviced regularly. Growth above the surface was due to the soil level being higher.

Mr S Wallace said that this was a natural occurrence and advised that the report from the ecologist would be given around the month of August.



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Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Breen, seconded by Councillor Kelly and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Removal of trees/hedgerows

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Breen

Can the council provide an update on the removal of trees/hedgerows at the entrance of Oakglade on the Blessington Road, Naas?

A report was received from the Transport, Mobility and Open Spaces Department informing the members that the Transportation Department has agreed to revised construction details which allows for the retention of the hedging on both sides of the Oak Glade Estate entrance and the revised design has been checked under the Road Safety Audit Stage 2 and the completed works will be examined under the Road Safety Audit Stage 3.

It should be noted that three existing trees will have to be removed to enable the works to be carried out which it is our understanding has been agreed with the Oak Glade Residents Association.

The construction works at this junction will be carried out shortly on site by the Developer Ballymore Homes.

Councillor Breen stated that she had been getting emails from the residents enquiring about who gave permission to cut the hedges.

Councillor Sammon advised councillor Breen that this was a condition of planning in relation to 3 additional houses in Oak Glade and agreement had been reached with the resident's association.

The report was noted.

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Sammon
Can the council confirm if a dog park is being considered as part of the upgrade to Monread Park?

A report was received from Mr. S Wallace, A/Senior Parks and Landscaping Officer informing the members that a dog park will be considered as part of the development of a master plan.

Playground in Ballymore Eustace

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Sammon
Can the council confirm the funding available for a playground in Ballymore Eustace?

A report was received from Mr. S Wallace, A/Senior Parks and Landscaping Officer informing the members that funding for a playground in Ballymore Eustace is not included in the current capital works budget. However, it will be considered for inclusion in the review of the programme in September.

The report was noted.

Commencement notices received for creches

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Sammon
That the council outline any commencement notices received for crèches in the Naas municipal district since 2022.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Sammon, seconded by Councillor Brett

A report was received by the Planning Department informing the members that having examined all Commencement notices received and verified same with Building Control Section, the Planning Department can confirm that only one Commencement Notice for Creche facilities has been received in this municipal district area during 2022 and 2023 to date. This Creche is located in Devoy Quarter and the notice was received in June 2022.



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Many of the Larger Developments known as SHD's and LRD's have creche facilities included in the development but of the ones commenced during 2022 and 2023 none of these are in this municipal district.

Councillor Sammon informed the members that there was a need to re-locate creches with schools or neighbourhood centres and not at the back of housing estates where they became unfit for purpose due to residents outgrowing the creche and not wanting the extra traffic through their estate.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Sammon seconded by Councillor Brett and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Complete the Kilmalum Estate

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Brett
That the council outline how it proposes to complete the Kilmalum estate at Blessington Manor where the developer is no longer in business (for over 12 years).

The motion was proposed by Councillor Brett, seconded by Councillor Sammon

A report was received by the Building and Development Control Department informing the members that Development Control hold a bond for Blessington Manor. Investigative works to the drainage infrastructure have been commissioned. Subject to the results an application and/or site resolution plan will be progressed with Uisce Éireann. Development Control have also engaged with the existing Management Company appointed by the receiver.

Communication is ongoing in relation to works that may be required to progress the taking in charge.

Councillor Brett stated that this was a positive report and advised that this estate needed to be prioritised.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Brett seconded by Councillor Sammon and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Taking in charge of Primrose Gardens

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Breen

Can the council provide an update on the taking in charge of Primrose Gardens Estate, Naas?

A report was received by the Building and Development Control Department informing the members that a warning letter, outlining the conditions of planning that had not been addressed, was sent to the Developer on Tuesday 9 May. Development Control subsequently met with the Developer at Áras Chill Dara on Friday 12 May regarding the outstanding works and information required for the taking in charge of Primrose Gardens, Naas. A four-week period was given to the Developer to provide the outstanding information and a program for completion of the outstanding works. The four-week period expired on Wednesday the 7 of June. Only partial information has been received and no program for completion of the development has been provided. Further discussions with the Planning Section in Kildare County Council will be undertaken to determine the best course of action moving forward.

Mr J Hennessey advised that he would update the members after the discussion with the Planning department.

The report was noted.

Suspend the byelaws for June, July and August

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Sammon



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That the council suspend the byelaws for June, July and August to allow trading in Market Square on Saturdays to expand the space for Naas Farmers Market.

The motion was proposed by Councillor Sammon, seconded by Councillor Brett

A report was received by Mr E Ryan, Municipal District Manager informing the members that there are currently no casual trading byelaws for Naas that would permit casual trading at Market Square and until the Naas Farmers Market out-grows its current location in the Potato Market, it would be premature to expand into Market Square.

In respect of the Parking byelaws, if this proposal was to have merit in the future, the Transport Department would require clarity in respect of the exact location of the parking bays to be suspended, the number of parking bays to be suspended and the dates and times of the required suspension. The Transport Department would recommend that the appointed taxi stand in the area is not suspended. The Transport Department would suggest that the five parking bays south of the Presbyterian Church be considered for any parking bay suspension requirements.

Councillor Sammon stated that maybe the motion was a bit premature as casual trading byelaws would need to be in place but suggested that possibly closing off the lane for a day would be an alternative.

Councillor Breen queried where stall holders could apply to and was advised the LEO office and Kildare Co Council looked after this.

Resolved on the proposal of Councillor Sammon seconded by Councillor Brett and agreed by the members that the report be noted.

Pumping station at Osberstown Sallins

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Kelly
Can the council confirm if the works, which were anticipated to commence in Q2/Q3 2023 on the construction of the new pumping station at Osberstown Sallins, have commenced?
A report was received by the Building and Development Control Department informing the members that Works have not commenced on the Osberstown pumping station due to a decision by Uisce Éireann.



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Development Control tendered for works to the Osberstown pumping station in January of 2023 on behalf of Uisce Éireann. Unfortunately, due to the costs received Uisce Éireann cancelled the tender. The Uisce Éireann legacy department complete an internal review of potential options to progress the works including utilising contractors from their Capital Works Framework. They have now appointed a contractor for the installation of the pumping station. It was agreed that Kildare County Council would tender for the civil works associated with the pumping station. A tender is due to go live this week. It is anticipated that works will commence Q3.

The report was noted.

Community building in St John's Grove Johnstown

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Brett

Can the council provide an update on the status of the Community building in St John's Grove Johnstown?

A report was given by Mr E Ryan, Municipal District Manager informing the members that having consulted with our legal team in Regan McEntee solicitors, it is considered that the planning authority are statute barred in relation to pursuing enforcement action against the developers of St. John's Grove, Johnstown for the transfer of community facilities to the residents for the following reasons,

The subject motion relates to Reg. Ref. 99/1831:

1) Planning permission for the development is in excess of 7no. years, therefore as per Section 157 (4) (a) (i) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended), namely (4) (A) "No warning letter or enforcement notice shall issue and no proceedings for an offence under this Part shall commence -

(i) In respect of a development where no permission has been granted, after seven years from the date of the commencement of the development."

2) In granting the permission An Bord Pleanála, granted the permission for the development subject to 17no. conditions. None of which relate specifically to the use or transfer of the community facilities.



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Councillor Brett asked if the management team would consider purchasing the building, the council could approach the owner and buy it.

The report was noted.
