COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

Mr. Chairman, My Lord and Gentlemen.

At the quarterly meetings of District Councils recently held to consider applications for payments or new works or new contracts, I have to report that as regards payments the total sum applied for by contractors amounted to £4508 9s 11d. Of

this sum £4263 18s 1d is payable for the quarter ending 31st December, 1901, and the balance (£244 11s 10d) was a deferred amount from the quarter ending 30th September, 1901. The manner in which the £4508 9s 11d was disposed of by the Proposal Committee and District Councils is shown in the following table:

As regards works which contractors would not undertake and which had to be placed in County Surveyor's charge I find that during last quarter (ending 31st December, 1901) the Finance Committee ordered to be paid out of Subsidiary Account on foot of these works the sum of £588 15s 6d. All necessary certificates, paysheets, vouchers etc. were presented to the Finance Committee and are in the Secretary's office. Of this £588 15s 6d the expenditure for Athy No. 1 was £193 5s; for Celbridge £19 10s; for Naas No. 1 £349 3s 7d; and for County at Large £26 16s 11d. During the same quarter the sum of £38 17s was paid out of Subsidiary Account by the Finance Committee for eight sudden damages as follows:—

- Athy No. 1 (1) Sudden collapse of part of Skirteen Bridge, Monasterevan. Cost for underpinning was £12 17s.
(2) Further sudden injury at same bridge—cost for paling and filling up dangerous parts. £6.

- Celbridge No. 1 Sudden falling in of gulleys and stoppage of a stream in Maynooth. Complaints reached me from the District Council, and I had to expend £5 in making good defects as well as to make examination to locate the cause of the stoppage of the water.

Edenderry No. 2

- (1) Part of Kilmurry Bridge between Dunferth and Carbury suddenly injured. Cost of temporary work and protection £3.

Naas No. 1.

- (2) One arch of the bridge near the Malt House, Rathangan, practically swept away by floods. It cost £6 for watchmen and temporary protection at this bridge. Trees floated down the Liffey caught across the arches of (1) Millicent Bridge and (2) Caragh Bridge and their removal was imperative. The sum of £6 was spent, that is £3 for each bridge.

Naas Urban

- A traction engine broke down a drain and grate near the Soldiers' Barracks in Naas. The cost of repairs under Sudden Damage Order was £1.

Only a few new works or contracts were passed at District Quarterly meetings and as I said in my last report this is as it should be. The proper time to pass new works or contracts is during the quarter ending 31st March or 30th June so as to give reasonable time and good weather to prepare road material as well as for masonry and other special work. Out of the 20 only 9 have been set to contractors, or I should rather say eight because in Athy No. 1 there was a mistake made in advertising the price allowed for 400 perches of a road at Lackagh. This means that the man who tendered and was accepted by the District Council cannot be accepted by the County Council. Nor can this road be given to the County Surveyor. There was no adjourned quarterly meeting in Maynooth for want of a quorum. Four works were to be tendered for there, and they must now fall through, but fortunately no serious inconvenience will occur by waiting till next quarter.

Hedge cutting is progressing pretty favourably, and especially since your solicitor took up some cases. At Petty Sessions in Kildare, Robertstown, Rathangan and Newbridge lately the magistrates gave the orders sought for cutting.

Mr. James Maher, of Oldtown was prosecuted at Naas Petty Sessions on 27th January, 1902, for encroaching with a new fence on the Naas and Kilculen road. He was fined £5 and costs or two months' imprisonment. Last Friday 14th inst. I passed where the encroachment took place and found the new fence was not removed. I spoke to Mr. Maher who was engaged taking down the original old fence (inside the new one) and spreading it for topdressing. I cannot say what Mr Maher will do but the new fence should not be allowed to stand as it is.

The extraordinary traffic arising from W D work around Kildare and the Curragh is further developing. Last month I had to write on the subject to the C R E (with a view to a future additional demand), and requested him meanwhile to have payment made at the rate of £431 2s per annum since the extraordinary traffic commenced. I received a reply in substance that the matter was being considered. For about 1½ miles of the road between Ballymannny and Kildare the price is 1s a perch, and had a beautiful smooth surface. Quite suddenly three traction engines with loaded waggons of bricks commenced to travel over it. The engines might

almost as well have plied over the green grass of the Curragh. The road surface got smashed up into pulp. In order to prevent accidents I had to get a Sudden Damage Order for £18, and I made arrangements so far for £12 worth of labour and material to be expended on this length of road. I cannot believe that the W D will refuse to pay for extraordinary traffic because there can be no room for doubt in the claims, and figures put before them which are not founded on estimates but on actual expenditure. From what I can hear the extraordinary traffic about Kildare and Curragh will increase rather than decrease. If so there will be a deadlock unless the legal limit for road expenditure in Naas No. 1 is increased. This limit is £7765. And this is how the matter stands. At the present moment the expenditure for ordinary road repair in Naas No. 1 is (as I make it) at the rate of about £7290 a year. Not a single penny is for a special work. If the present prices have to be much exceeded it will be a serious matter, because any money passed in excess of the "limit" would I suppose be surcharged on the County Council. At Naas No. 1 quarterly meeting the estimate agreed to for the year ending 31st March, 1903, was £7650. As things stand it would be dangerous to entertain any new work except of very trivial outlay in Naas No. 1. Is this a correct thing for a district circumstanced as Naas No. 1 is? The District Councils and Proposal Committee at recent quarterly meetings agreed to estimates of expenditure for year ending 31st March, 1903, and I think it is right to put them before you. The estimates for coming year are the same as last time for Athy No. 1, Celbridge No. 1, Naas Urban and Proposal Committee. In Baltinglass and Edenderry they are £100 less than for last year. In Naas No. 1 the last estimate was £7000.

I think all the above estimates are fair and reasonable, but as regards Naas No. 1 no one can say

whether it will be sufficient or not to meet what may turn out to be absolutely imperative expenditure. It will mostly depend upon extraordinary traffic, and the state of the labour market at Kildare and the Curragh, and also upon the state of the labour market for miles around these places
