Lissa Oliver - Reading & Book Signing




Parents and Other Strangers: Dermot Bolger, Peter Sheridan and Carlo Gébler in conversation

No relationship shapes our character so much as the intense, early relationship that we have with our parents. In this intimate public conversation, the poet and novelist Dermot Bolger talks to two of Ireland's leading writers about their relationships with their own parents, during their childhoods and adult lives, and how these relationships have helped to form their own personalities and outlook.

Born in Dublin in 1959, **Dermot Bolger's** ten novels include *The Woman's Daughter, The Journey Home, The Family on Paradise Pier* and *New Town Soul.* In 2010 he published *A Second Life: A Renewed novel.* Author of thirteen stage plays, his Ballymun Trilogy was published in 2010. He has published eight volumes of poetry, devised the best-selling collaborative novel, *Finbar's Hotel* and has edited numerous anthologies, including *The Picador Book of Contemporary Irish Fiction.*





Peter Sheridan is one of Ireland's best known writers, who co-founded the Project Arts Centre with his brother Jim. An acclaimed theatre director, his recent credits include *The Shawshank Redemption* at the Gaiety and most recently, *Dancing Shoes – the George Best Story*, at the Grand Opera House, Belfast. He is the author of two acclaimed memoirs, 44: A Dublin Childhood and Forty Seven Roses.

Carlo Gébler was born in Dublin in 1954. His parents were the writers Edna O'Brien and Ernest Gébler. Carlo's debut novel, *The Eleventh Summer*, was published in 1985. This was followed by many others including *August in July; Work and Play; How to Murder a Man* and *A Good Day for a Dog*. His classic memoir, *Father and I*, explores what it is like to be a writer who is the son of writers. His new novel, *The Dead Eight*, is published in spring 2011.
