



Introduction

1. Background

Welcome to the Kildare Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) Implementation Plan (2024-2026) to inform the delivery of the Kildare LECP 2024-2029. Kildare County Council (KCC) adopted the LECP on April 29th, 2024.

The LECP sets out the framework, objectives and actions to promote Kildare's economic and local/community development over a six-year period. In addition, applications for funding, e.g., EU Just Transition funding, are increasingly required to align with the LECP.

The development of the LECP followed detailed national guidelines and took over fourteen months to complete. The final plan was informed by a review of the first LECP, an analysis of a wide range of EU, national, regional and local policies and strategies, extensive consultation, and alignment with the county's community and economic priorities.

The guidelines outline that all LECPs should be accompanied by an Implementation Plan to prioritise deliverable actions. This two-year plan has been compiled in collaboration with a broad range of stakeholders from across statutory, voluntary/community and business sectors.

While every effort was made to ensure that the key community and economic development priorities for the county are included, changes maybe required as part of the review and monitoring process. The LECP Vision and Goals alongside the process to develop the Implementation Plan are outlined below. 2. LECP Vision

The Kildare LECP Vision is outlined as follows:

County Kildare; working together as a sustainable, inclusive, economically vibrant, healthy community for all.



3. LECP High Level Goals

There are four High Level Goals outlined below:

High Level Goal One:



County Kildare is a **PLACE** with resilient communities where all people live full, healthy and inclusive lives.

This goal has eighteen objectives in total. Seven are specific to community, five to economic development, and six are shared as both community and economic development.

High Level Goal Two:



County Kildare nurtures its **PEOPLE** to reach their full potential and to enjoy a high quality of life at all stages.

This goal has fifteen objectives in total. Four are specific to community, six to economic development, and five are shared as both community and economic development.

High Level Goal Three:



County Kildare promotes and prioritises **CLIMATE ACTION, CLIMATE JUSTICE and SUSTAINABILITY**

This goal has nine objectives in total. One is specific to community, one to economic development, and seven are shared as both community and economic development.

High Level Goal Four:



County Kildare attracts the **RESOURCES and INVESTMENT** to be a sustainable, inclusive, economically vibrant community for all.

This goal has six objectives in total. Three are specific to community, one to economic development, and two are shared as both community and economic development.

4. Developing the Implementation Plan

The stakeholders involved in the LECP were asked to indicate their priorities 2024-2026 to progress the Kildare LECP goals and objectives. In addition to Kildare County Council, other state agencies, voluntary and community sector organisations and employer representatives were also involved in this process.

Several of the priority actions are also outlined in other key plans, e.g., Climate Action Plan, Children and Young Peoples Services Committee Plan, etc. This helps to ensure that the county's priorities are clearly identified and re-stated. It is recognised that the majority of the priority actions will require funding. Central government funding is available through various agencies and non-departmental public bodies. The priority actions are intended to align with current and possible future funding.

While every effort has been made to agree upon lead and support agencies, the list of such agencies is not intended to be exclusive but rather a framework from which to build additional collaborations.




Sustainable Community Objectives
